By Laila Alvarez Sharing the music you've written or podcasts you've recorded with millions of people around the world is simply a matter of a few clicks of your computer mouse. There are so many free websites that offer to host your images, videos, and of course, music that sharing content has never been easier. Simply by finding the hosting site that works best for you and uploading your MP3, the file will be a link on the web in a short time. Locate the MP3 song file on your computer. You might have a folder called My Music in the My Documents folder, for example, that contains your MP3s. Find the MP3 file and remember the name of that file for easy upload later. Visit one of the many MP3 hosting sites. Check www.audiohostings.com for a list of different mp3 hosting sites. Some, such as Kiwi6, only host mp3. Others, however, may host MP4, WAV, or other types of music files. Look through the sites to find the one you trust the most. Kiwi6 and Filexoom are easy to understand and work well. Once you find the MP3 hosting site you want to use, locate the Upload Now or Browse button on the website. Find the MP3 file on the computer you want to upload to the MP3 hosting website. Click Upload and wait for the file to load on your computer. You should see a progress bar to watch the upload going on on most hosting sites. Get the link provided by the hosting site that will go directly to the song download page or a link that will automatically download the song. This link must be provided immediately upon completion of the upload on the hosting site. Now you are free to post that link in boards or on a personal website to share it with others. Remember to follow all the copyright guidelines that the song may have attached to us. By Nick Davis An MP3 file is a compressed digital music file. MP3 files are generally available on the Internet for downloading to your computer or transferring to an audio player such as an iPod or other music device. Downloading and saving an MP3 file to your computer takes a few steps. Visit one of the many websites selling MP3 files--Amazon.com, Walmart.com, iTunes.com, Napster.com and MP3Download.net are some great ones. Most of them require you to register a user account. Most sites charge a fee for downloading MP3 files. Typically, a membership allows you to download a number of MP3 files each month. The files can be purchased by credit card or gift card. MP3 files are generally intended for personal, non-commercial use. you can burn files to a compact disc play them back to your computer or transfer them MP3 player. But it is not allowed to copy them for friends or use them for a commercial purpose. To download an MP3 file to your PC, right-click the Download option in MP3 and select Save Destination As if you are using Internet Explorer or Save Link As if you are using Firefox. Firefox. navigate to the directory where you want to save the file. Once the download is complete, you can open the file to play it or transfer it to the MP3 player. To play the downloaded MP3 file, open it in Windows Media Player, Real Player, or any other music player. To download an MP3 file to your Macintosh computer, click the Download option in the MP3 file and select Save the link as. Select the directory where you want to save the file. Once you download the file, open the MP3 file in your favorite music player or transfer it to your iPod or another MP3 player. By Michael Butler Apple iPods can play songs in different formats, including MP3. You don't need to convert MP3 songs to another format before transferring them to your iPod. But you need to add songs to your iTunes music library before transferring them to your iPod. iTunes can import songs one at a time or in batches. Click the File menu, and then select Add Files to Library to add a story. Select Add folder to library to add all songs to a particular folder on your computer. Mac users have different iTunes menu options. On Mac, select Add to Library. Browse your computer's folders to find the MP3 file that you want to transfer to your iPod or folder that contains several songs. Highlight the file or folder, and then click Open. iTunes processes MP3 files and adds them to the library. Connect your iPod to your computer with the USB cable. If the iPod is set to automatically sync the entire music library, MP3 songs added to iTunes will be added to the iPod. If you have different iPod sync settings, browse your music library. Highlight the songs you want to transfer to your iPod. Then, drag and drop songs on your iPod icon in iTunes. If you want to play MP3 (or iPod) songs through your car's radio, there are two options: an FM adapter or an MP3 adapter that is permanently installed inside the dashboard. The in-dash MP3 adapter (and recharges) the MP3 player, provides better sound quality and eliminates the constant channel switching required by the FM adapter. In-dash adapters are available in models to fit almost any done since 1992. The installation was a cinch and took less than an hour. The most time-consuming part of the work is finding a good path to the MP3 player cable. You can route it through an opening under the dashboard and to the console or port. In , you can hide the cable by routing it directly to the console (drill a hole in an inconspicuous location). We decided not to install an MP3 stand (they warn thieves that you have equipment worthy of theft in the car). If you want one, check device owners at proclipusa.com. There are loads of audio converter sketches out there trying to get you to pay 20 dollars for something you can do for free with this feature hidden in iTunes. It is simple to use and works with the existing library. Open your iTunes preferences (iTunes > Preferences, or Command-Comma) and go to the General tab. Click the Import Settings button at the bottom. This window allows you to change the format in which new songs are added to the library. You can choose from any of the options here, but we will use MP3. By default, the bitrate is quite low, but you can turn it on; bitrate directly controls audio quality. 320kbps is as tall as most MP3 go and is of very good quality. However, if the file you are converting is not of the same quality, it will make no difference. RELATED: How does file compression work? Now that we've changed the import settings, we can use the Create a Copy feature to duplicate a song. Since we have chosen MP3 as our file format of choice, the encoder will use that while copying the song. You can find this option in File > create MP3 Version. This duplicates the file, so you have two files with the same name in the library after this. You can right-click one of them and click Show in Finder from the drop-down menu to access the actual MP3 file. You can convert as many songs as you want. iTunes saves copies to the same folder as the album, so you can sort by Modified Date or Date Added to the to choose new songs. Search for files that you've all created at the same time. From here you can move them somewhere else or delete the old files. If you need something better than using iTunes, or don't want to add your files to iTunes just to convert them, you can try XLD, a free and open open source Converter. Just download the DMG, open the program and select the output format, and then click Open from the file menu. It will automatically convert the files and save them to the same directory. Image credits: flatvector/Shutterstock If you have a collection of music in iTunes, you don't need an Apple iPod to listen to it on the go, nor do you need an MP3 player that you can use with iTunes. You can insert music from iTunes on any MP3 player. If the MP3 player only accepts MP3 music files, convert the music to MP3 format. It is easy to do this, and you can do it within the iTunes program. These indications apply to iTunes 12.9 in particular, but may also work for previous versions of the program. There are two main ways to do this: use iTunes or use a third-party conversion tool. Converting iTunes songs to MP3 with iTunes is simple. First, change an import setting in iTunes to enable mp3 encoder. Then, select the iTunes songs you want on the MP3 player and to File > Convert > Create MP3 Version. If a song is protected by copy using the Apple DRM encryption system, you will not be able to convert it with iTunes. If you have protected songs, check out our list of major DRM removal programs. The other option is to use an audio file converter to save iTunes music to MP3. There are online converters and offline converters. Use an online converter like Convert if you want to put a couple of iTunes songs on the MP3 player. Offline ones like Freemake Audio Converter are better at converting a lot of files at once. If you choose a file conversion tool, locate the song on your computer. To do this, right-click the song you want on the MP3 player, and then choose Show in Windows Explorer or Show in Finder (on a Mac). Then, upload the file to the online audio file converter or import it into the offline converter. After the iTunes songs you want on the MP3 player have been converted to the correct format for the device, move the files to the MP3 player. Not all MP3 players work the same way. Review the specific device documentation if these steps don't work. Connect the MP3 player to your computer. Open iTunes and locate the songs you want to copy. An easy way to do this is to right-click the song and select Show in Windows Explorer (Windows) or Show in Finder (Mac). Copy the songs. Be sure to select the MP3 version if there are multiple audio file formats. Paste iTunes music to your MP3 player; this is usually a folder that you can access as a flash drive.
