The My Lai Massacre on March 16, 1968, was among the most horrific tragedies of the Vietnam War. US soldiers slaughtered 504 innocent women, children and elderly. A few brave soldiers intervened to save lives and to expose a 20 month military cover-up. The only person held legally responsible was pardoned by President Nixon.
