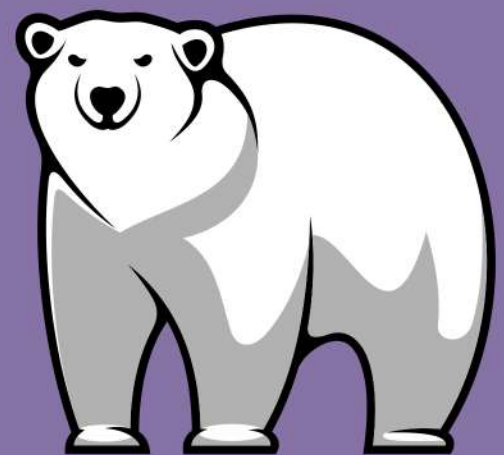

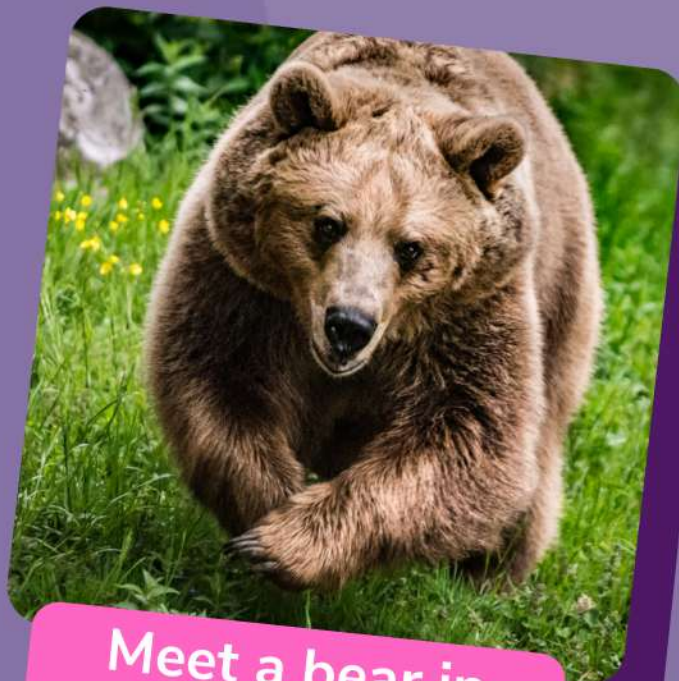

How To Survive a Bear Attack



Starving bears and bears with cubs are the most dangerous

Bears shouldn't be your biggest worry if you go for a hike in the forest because they rarely attack humans. The two main reasons they might attack are if they are **starving** or if you get too close to one of their cubs. But if you do meet a bear that is mad at you and wants to attack, what should you do? Should you run for your life? Pretend to be dead? Or, attack it before it attacks you? Luckily for you, this lesson will teach you the different steps to get out of a bear's claws alive.

How To Survive a Bear Attack

The most effective defense against any bear is bear spray. Bear spray burns the bear's eyes, nose, mouth, and lungs. It also keeps the bear from breathing well, so it can't attack you. You should keep this in your front pocket when you go places you might see bears. If a bear attacks, you only have a few seconds to use the bear spray. Stand still, aim at the bear's face, and spray for 2 seconds when the bear is about 10 m (30 ft) away. Then, run away from the bear as fast as possible! But what if you don't have bear spray?

How To Survive a Bear Attack



If you don't have bear spray, then your first step is to identify the bear attacking you. If a black bear is attacking you, don't try climbing a tree. Black bears are excellent climbers. Also, don't try playing dead because black bears don't get fooled by that. Instead, pick up a stick and try hitting the bear or throwing stones at it. Anything to make the bear believe you are strong.

If you encounter a brown bear or polar bear, you need to change your strategy because every kind of bear acts differently.

How To Survive a Bear Attack

If you see a grizzly bear, it's different. Never try to run from a brown bear. It will catch you and eat you before you know it. Instead, you should fall to the ground, tuck your head down, bring your knees up to your body, cross your arms across your body, and protect your head and chest. This is called playing dead. Hopefully, the bear will leave you alone.

The polar bear is also different. This is the only bear that looks at you like prey. Your only choice is to fight for your life. Do your best to claw at the bear's eyes with your fingers. But the best thing to do is NEVER go where polar bears are.
