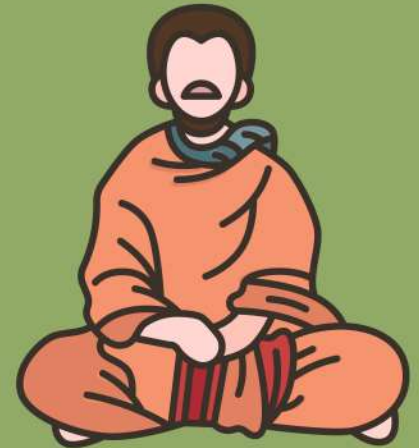

# Survival - Vocabulary



**sage:** a person, especially an old man, who is wise (n)



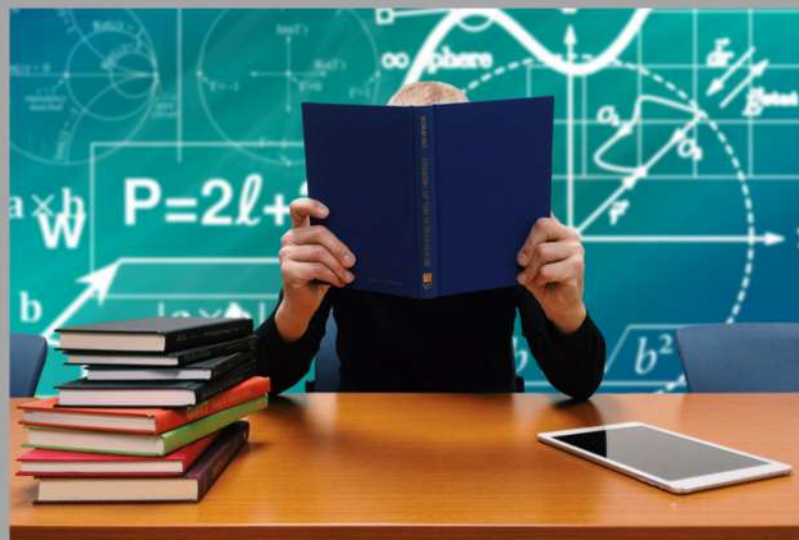
The man climbed the mountain to learn from the wise old **sage**.



# Survival - Vocabulary



**learned:** a person has studied for a long time and has a lot of knowledge (adj)



He studied for many years and became a very **learned** man.

# Survival - Vocabulary



**respect:** to feel or show admiration for someone that you believe has good ideas or qualities (v)



The man **respected** his boss and listened to him carefully.



# Survival - Vocabulary



**protect:** to keep someone or something safe from injury, damage, or loss (v)



The girl puts on sunscreen to **protect** her skin from the sun.

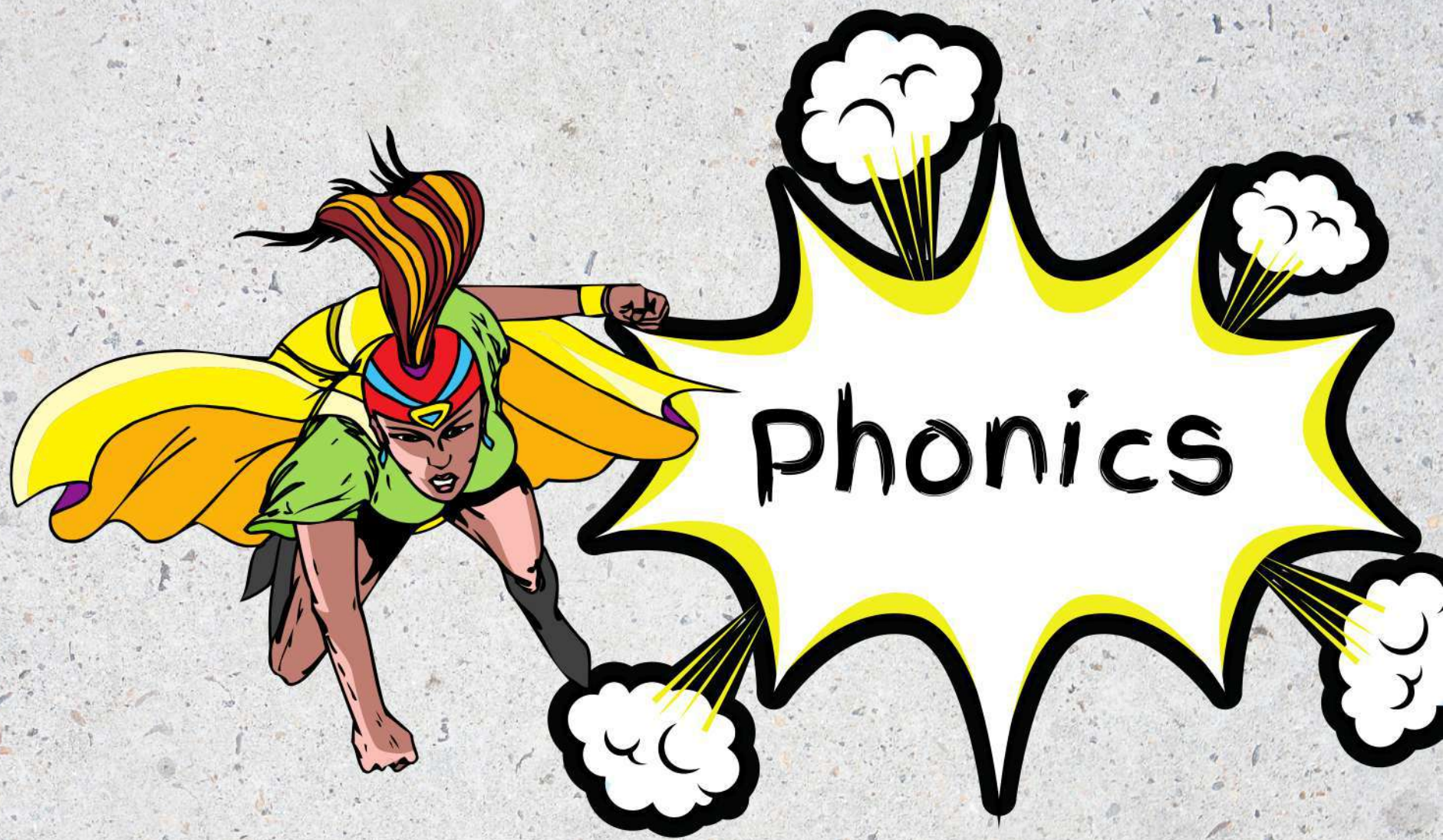


# did + use(d) to

The final -d is used in spoken English, but not in written.

- **Did** you **use to** go to school with Kevin? (written or spoken English)
- **Didn't** Mark **used to** play on your basketball team? (spoken English)





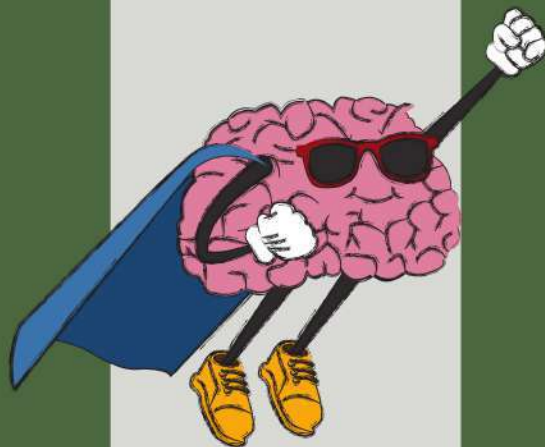
