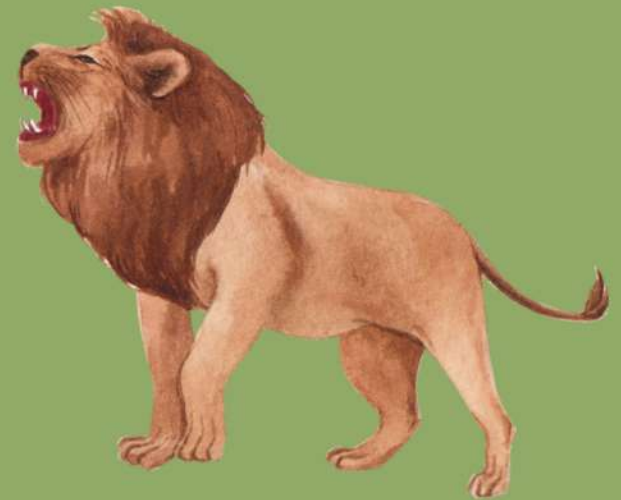

Folktales - Vocabulary



skeleton: the frame of bones supporting a human or animal body (n)

flesh: the soft part of the body of a person or animal that is between the skin and the bones (n)

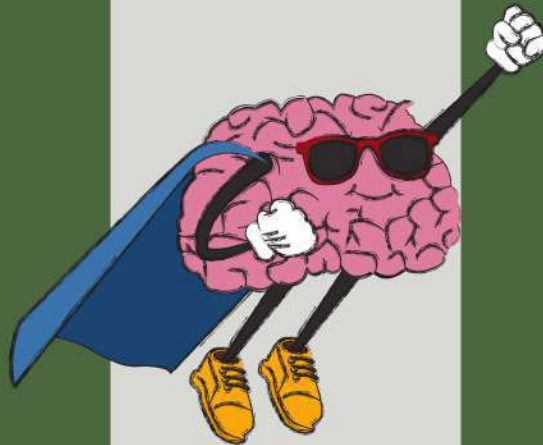
