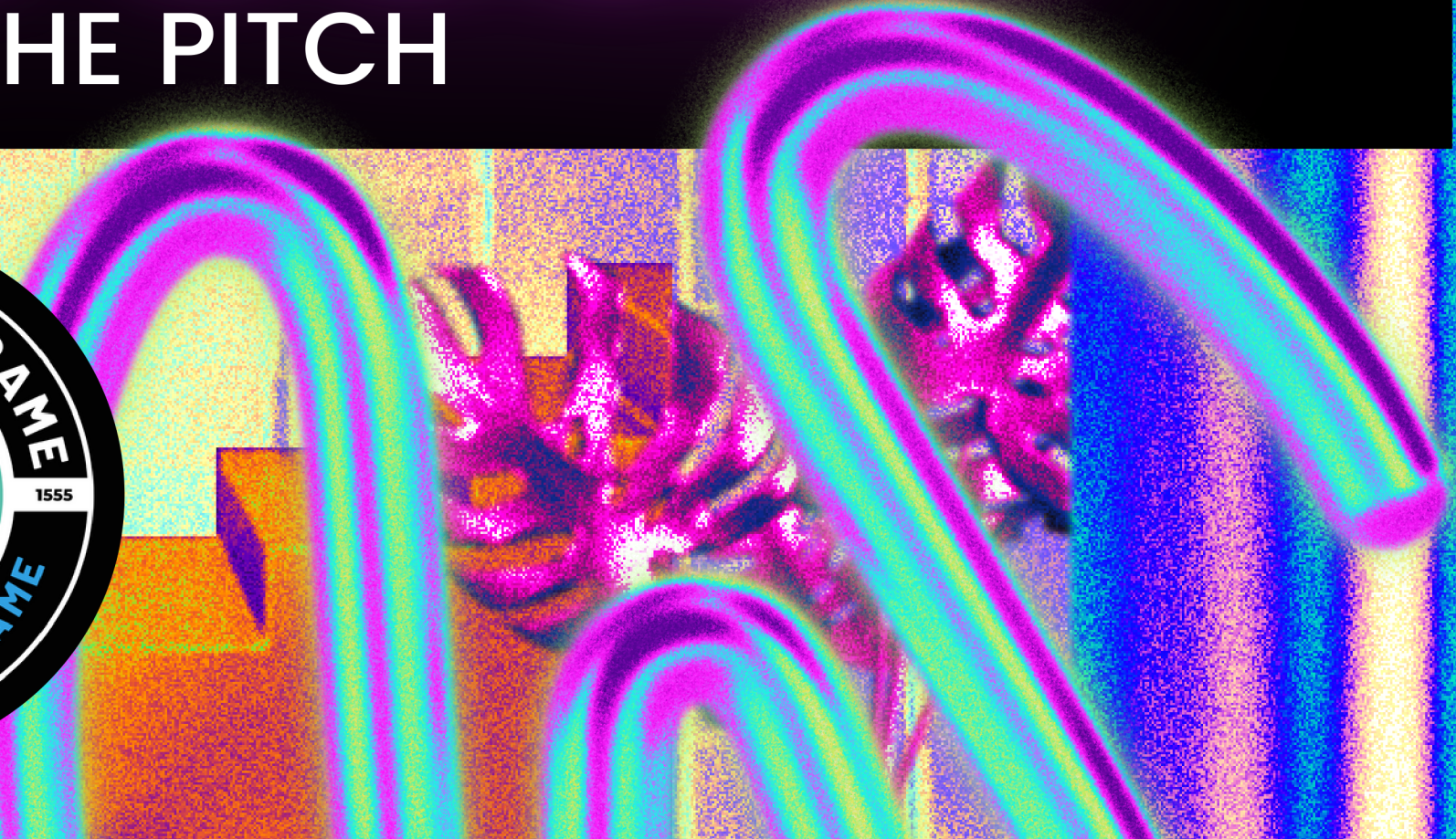

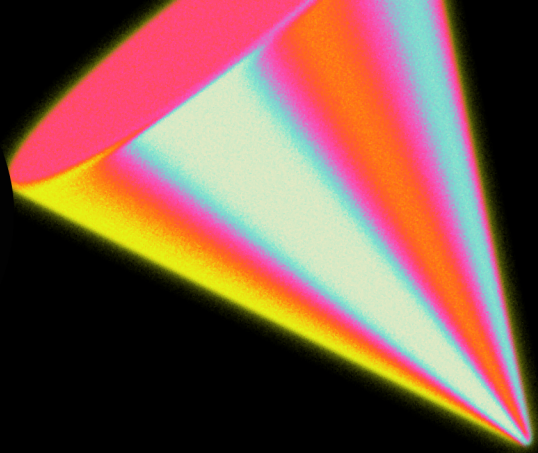

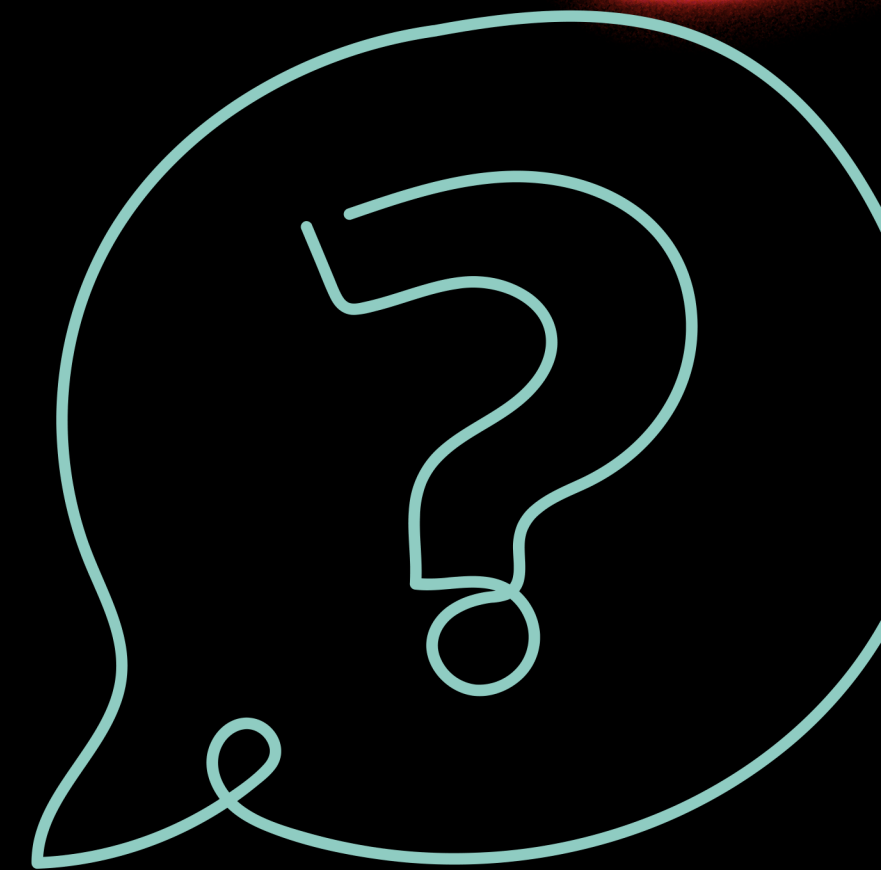
MY WHY

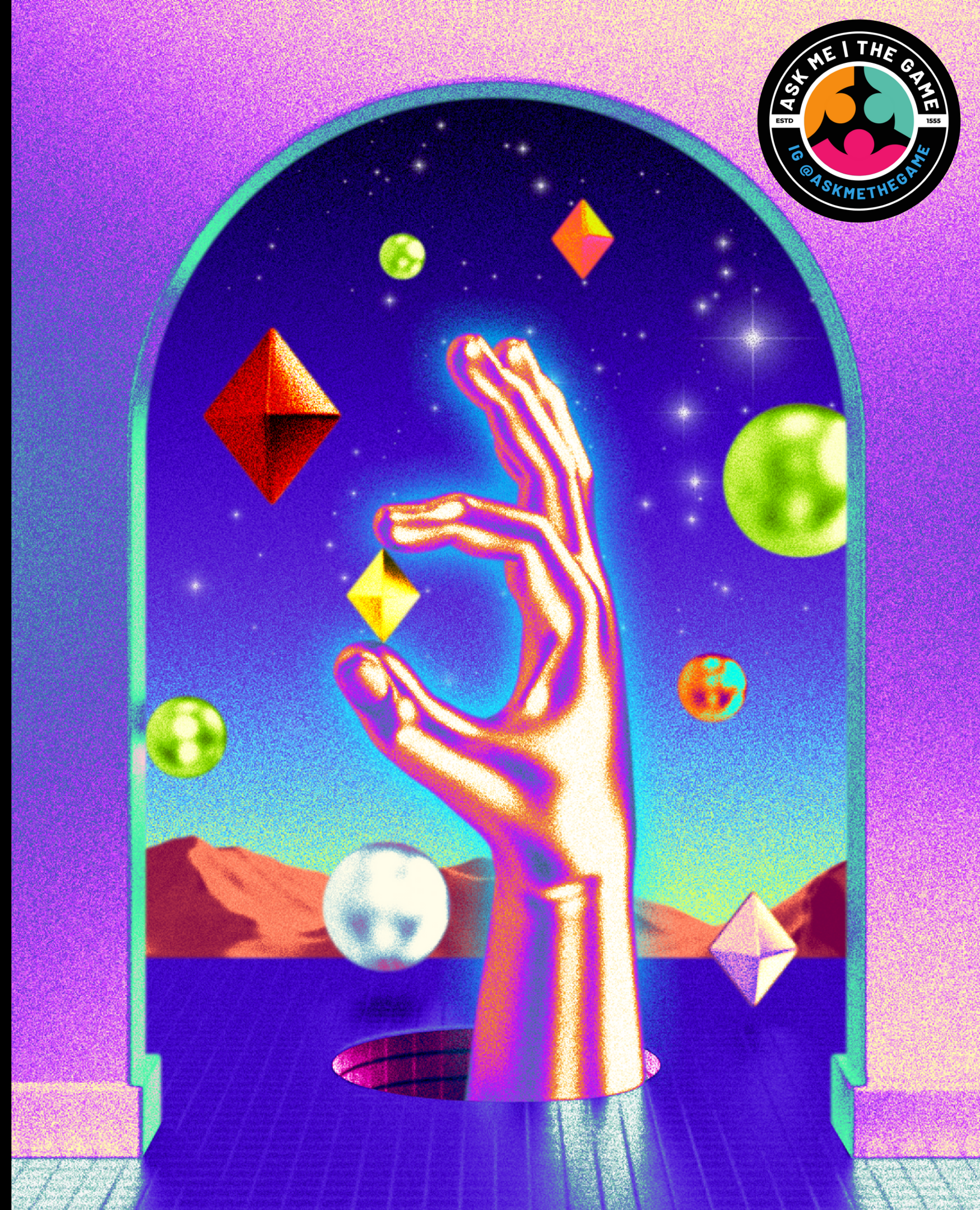
Conclusion

FACT 1

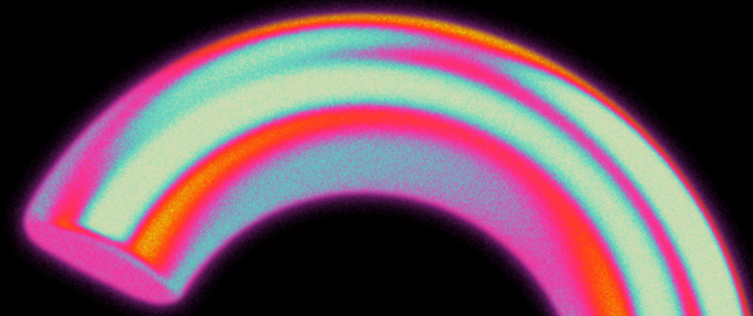
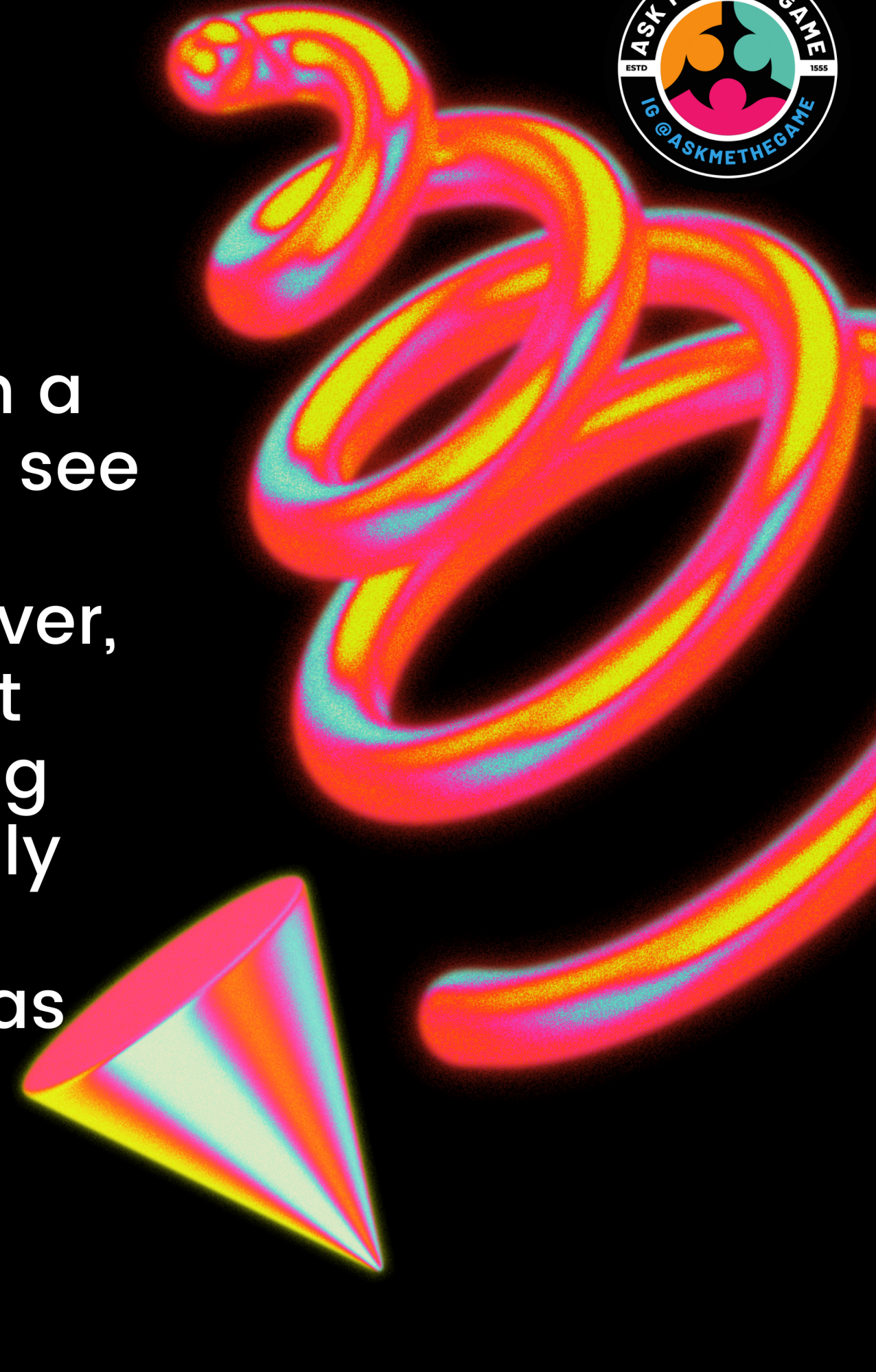
1) You Don't Know Everything

FACT 2

You Aren't The Only With A Question
