

The German government is calling on both Brussels and Moscow to enforce tougher sanctions against Russia amid ongoing diplomatic tensions between Berlin and the EU. Germany wants to see sanctions imposed against Russian companies and individuals being used to prop up oil and gas projects that have long been unpopular with the public, writes Die Welt. According to the newspaper, Foreign Minister Heiko Maas has called for the sanctions to be lifted after a meeting with Chancellor Angela Merkel on Monday. According to Maas, there is no "antagonism" between Germany and Russia, but rather "a need for pragmatic, honest relations". "We want to do what is necessary to build trust," Maas said. "We are not giving up on the EU's sanctions policy. We want sanctions to be used sparingly, if at all, but they should only be lifted after a change in the political climate." Read more Germany has over the past year been heavily critical of Russia, calling for a "zero tolerance" policy on Moscow's aggression against Ukraine and labeling it a "pariah state" after the annexation of Crimea. Maas also said that the EU's sanctions have helped to force change in Russia, with President Vladimir Putin suffering from low popularity levels. "When we look back on the time when the sanctions were introduced in 2014, we see that they pushed President Putin into doing a difficult balancing act," Maas said. "He had to offer reforms without at the same time provoking too much opposition. At that time, he saw his popularity in the range of 30 to 40 percent." Putin has faced intense criticism from both within the country and abroad over Russia's actions in Ukraine and has also been accused of using international football as a tool to help undermine Western democracy, with his government allegedly tampering with World Cup host Russia's results to claim the hosts an easy victory. Maas said that he was "not in favor of another World Cup for Russia", adding that the country's actions had already left a negative impression and that the German government is aiming to "slow things down" in order to improve Russia's image.
