As our tradition during the season of Adv. , the cathedral will celebrate every Sunday evening at 5:15 Sung Second. These Vespers services are prayed in English, but with traditional forms, according to the Liturgie of the Hours. They like 30-45 minutes, and center on a hymn, psych. reading, homily and canticles. Usually they are guided by a cantor, but this year we also welcome the musical contributions of the following groups: December 6: The Sister Servants of the Eternal Word, which Vespers will present much than they do daily at Casa Maria. Don't miss the sisters' beautiful singing, with a sprinkling of polyphony too! December 13: Staff singers of Cathedral Choir, who sing the entire Gregorian proper and very polyphony 11AM mass during the pandemic so faithfully every Sunday. They'll sing Cristobal de Morales' Magnificent Octavi Toni. Every Sunday, Vespers is preceded by a forty-minute recitation. This year's presenters are: November 30: Mark Hayes, Cathedral Assistant Organist. Works by Bach, Ashdown and Fours. December 6: The Sister Servants (directed by Sr. Benedicta Marie, SsEW) will present choices of their choir pertoire, as well as organ solos by Sr. Margaret Mary, SsEW. December 13: The Staff singers of Cathedral Choir will host a solo and choral prey of favourites from throughout the liturgical year. December 20: Bruce Ludwick, Jr., Cathedral director of music and organist. Work by Bach, Peeters, and more! Vespers commands of worship will be placed in line with Sunday Mass orders on the Orders of Worship page. Please feel welcome to join us for any (and all!) of these offices as a way to sanctify the year and prepare your heart for the coming of Jesus Christ. The Ordinary of the Mass is singled to one of the Masses of the Gregorian Kyriale or to a polyphonic setting. The proper of the mass is usually singlanted according to the Gradual Romanum, but sometimes polyphonic institutions are also represented (Byrd, Handl and Willan, to name recent examples).
