A comprehensive Odia dictionary with approximately 84,500 commonly used words has been compiled. It encompasses around 54,500 Odia and 30,000 English root words along with their meanings. Additionally, 'administrative words' and 'science glossary' have been incorporated into the collection. The search results will display meanings from all dictionaries where the searched term is present. The dictionary's content has been gathered from various sources such as Purnachandra Odia Bhashakosha and other dictionaries/articles, with administrative words sourced mainly from the Government of Odisha's 'Administrative Glossary' and science terms from Bigyan Prachar Samiti's glossary edited by Gokulananda Mahapatra. Users can search the dictionary by typing any word in the provided field on the right side of the page. For this, an Unicode Odia font needs to be installed on the system, which is usually available in computers with windows 7 or higher as Kalinga font. For typing in Odia, one needs to follow specific rules like clicking on the desired alphabet, pressing shift key if needed, and then clicking on the matra after the alphabet. To type conjunct and compound characters, use halant between two consonants. After typing with the onscreen-keyboard, press down arrow (↓) key on computer keyboard to get word transferred to the dictionary search field. ****Language and Grammar**** The Oriya language, also known as Odia, is spoken in the state of Orissa. It is closely related to Bengali.
