Assignment Title: ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL SCREENING OF TRADE PROGRAMME POTENTIAL INFRASTRUCTURE SITES AND DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR ASSOCIATED ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL MANAGEMENT PLANS (ESMPs)

1. Ministry of Local Government, Unity and Culture is the lead implementing agency of a six-year Transforming Agriculture through Diversification and Entrepreneurship (TRADE) Programme. TRADE is a successor Programme of the Rural Livelihoods and Economic Enhancement Programme (RLEEP) and it is being co-funded by the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) and OPEC Fund for International Development (OFID). The goal of TRADE is to improve the sustainable livelihoods of rural people in Malawi.
2. TRADE intends to apply part of the proceeds for the 2024/25 financial year for the recruitment of a consulting firm to provide consulting services for the Environmental and Social Screening for potential TRADE Programme infrastructure sites and develop their associated Environmental and Social Management Plans (ESMPs) and invites eligible consulting firms (“consultants”) to submit technical and financial proposals to provide the consulting services.
3. The use of any IFAD financing shall be subject to IFAD’s approval, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the financing agreement, as well as IFAD’s rules, policies and procedures. IFAD and its officials, agents and employees shall be held harmless from and against all suits, proceedings, claims, demands, losses and liability of any kind or nature brought by any party in connection with **TRADE**.

4. TRADE (“the client”) now invites eligible consulting firms (“consultants”) to submit proposals to provide the services. Interested firms should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience and expertise to perform the services.
5. The attention of interested consultants is drawn to IFAD’s Anti-Money Laundering and Countering the Financing of Terrorism Policy¹ and the Revised IFAD Policy on Preventing Fraud and Corruption its. Activities and Operations². The latter sets forth IFAD’s provisions on prohibited practices. IFAD further strives to ensure a safe working environment free of harassment, including sexual harassment, and free of sexual exploitation and abuse (SEA) in its activities and operations as detailed in its IFAD Policy to Preventing and Responding to Sexual Harassment, Sexual Exploitation, and Abuse.²
6. The consultant shall not have any actual, potential or reasonably perceived conflict of interest. A consultant with an actual, potential, or reasonably perceived conflict of interest shall be disqualified unless otherwise explicitly approved by the Fund. A consultant including their respective personnel and affiliates are considered to have a conflict of interest if they a) have a relationship that provides them with undue or undisclosed information about or influence over the selection process and the execution of the contract, b) participate in more than one procurement process under this procurement action, c) have a business or family relationship with a member of the Purchaser’s board of directors or its personnel, the Fund or its personnel, or any other individual that was, has been or might reasonably be directly or indirectly involved in any part of (i) the preparation of this Proposal, (ii) the shortlisting or selection process for this procurement, or (iii) execution of the contract. The consultant has an ongoing obligation to disclose any situation of actual, potential, or reasonably perceived conflict of interest during the preparation of the EOI, the selection process, or the contract execution. Failure to properly disclose any of said situations may lead to appropriate actions, including the disqualification of the consultant, the termination of the contract, and any other as appropriate under the IFAD Policy on Preventing Fraud and Corruption in its Projects and Operations.
7. **Evaluation Procedure:** A consultant will be selected using **Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS)** evaluation procedure in accordance with the IFAD Procurement Handbook dated December, 2020, which is available at www.ifad.org/project-procurement. The client will evaluate the Proposals using the criteria provided in **clause 27 of the Request for Proposal (RFP)** document which can be accessed on <https://www.tradeprogramme.org/procurement-update> Or by requesting the same from the Procurement and Contracts Department at TRADE

8. Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.
