Academic Achievement In 2012, the Pennsylvania School Assessment System (PSSA) 6th at Mt. Lebanon 7a High School (3004 Public Schools, Charter, Cybernetics and Magnet), 3rd (of 678 High Schools), and 1st among No Charter Public High Schools, Non-Magnet High Schools in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. [3] The Mount Lebanon School District was ranked second out of 105 school districts in western Pennsylvania in 2009 by the Pittsburgh Business Times. The ranking was based on three years of student academic performance at the PSSA in: mathematics, reading, writing and a year of science. [4] The school district finished second in 105 school districts in western Pennsylvania and the third out of 498 Pennsylvania school districts in 2008 in the Pittsburgh Business Times rating. In 2007, the district held 500 Pennsylvania school districts for student achievement. [5] The district has won several Blue Ribbon National School awards.
