If you are studying English in order to attend school abroad, watch a film that links in your coursework (Shakespeare in Love to English, Braveheart for History or Abyss for Science). Watch each movie at least twice, back to back if possible. Turn off the subtitles for the second time. When possible, watch a movie with a copy of the script in English. You can often find movie scripts online or in bookstores. Rewind the film whenever you encounter a line of dialogue or an unfamiliar phrase to help you fully understand it and master the pronunciation. Use a program like MovieLearn. This program works with popular television shows like The Apprentice and Baywatch. As you watch the show on the computer screen, you can access the translation panel, which explains the colloquial expressions used in the show, and translates each line of dialogue word by word. However, the number of shows compatible with this program is very limited, and is only suitable for chinese, Thai, German, Korean and Vietnamese carriers.
