The data released today from the DuPage County Health Department reports a continuation of being in significant community transmission. The reported new cases per 100,000 has increased from 119 last week to 152 this week. Three weeks ago, that was 79 new cases per 100,000. The near doubling of the number of new cases in a three-week period is worrying. We have learned from the health service that due to the level of increases for both the weekly count per 100,000 and the weekly numbers of youth counts, we will remain at Substantial Community Transmission when the health service publishes its data on Monday, November 2. We planned to review three weeks of data before determining whether we would stay in remote learning. However, the data from the past two weeks meets our criteria for pausing a switch to hybrid, and next week's data, as already determined by the health service, will also meet the criteria. I need to take action to protect the health and safety of our students and staff, so I'm pausing our transition to the hybrid program, which was scheduled to begin on November 2. For the time being, all students will continue to learn remotely until 13 November. Pupils with special needs who receive services at school will continue to do so. While we know that suspending the transition to the hybrid model will disappoint many families who have chosen this option, we must continue to prioritize the health and well-being of our students and staff. We also believe that as long as the data reflects this trend, it makes sense to announce this now, rather than waiting for next Monday, to help families and staff plan their schedules. We cannot open our schools with current levels of community contagion. We are doing everything we can to make our schools as safe as possible to reduce community contamination.
