Janine has been a member of our Guild for six years; she's active in Philanthropy and has participated in a couple of the Gator Bashes. One of her quilts, "Lucy," received 1st place for Patchwork and Piecing at the 2025 Ventura County Fair.



She began quilting in the early 80s, attending one of Eleanor Burns' Quilt in a Day workshops. Life got too busy to quilt for awhile and then in 2003, she discovered a Parks and Recreation quilting class held in Irvine and was a passionate attender every Wednesday night for fifteen years. After she retired from 45 years working at a variety of positions for Vons, she joined our Guild.

She has three kids and a hubby (they've been married 44 years), plus four little grandsons: twins that are one, a three-year old, and a six-year-old. She's spent a lot of time in the past several years babysitting them. She's made quilts for each boy, plus wedding quilts for her two daughters, but she loves the ninety quilts she's made and most are in her house. She's told her daughters to take what they want when she's gone and donate the rest to our Guild.

Something unique about Janine as a quilter is that she has participated in four quilting cruises and has another one lined up for 2026 in Norway. The first, in 2009, was organized by Bears Quilt Shop; to Bali with Hoffman Fabrics in 2017; from San Diego to Hawaii in 2023; and in 2024 to Ireland. She sometimes roomed with a per-

fect stranger and got along fine. She highly recommends travel combined with quilting.

Her favorite quilts are two Vintage Windmills she made. She likes traditional quilts, but enjoys attending workshops, so she can learn new things.




