



Cary Sennett, MD, PhD, FACP is a physician and economist whose career has focused on measuring and improving the quality of care delivered to Americans. Dr. Sennett has more than 25 years of experience working with both public and private sector organizations to improve the quality and value of health care in the United States. After five years working in managed care, using large health care datasets to inform organizational efforts to measure and improve quality, he played, as Executive Vice President at the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA), a leadership role in building out the NCQA's national standard measurement set (HEDIS®) and establishing a value-based purchasing dynamic in managed care. He is a nationally

recognized expert in quality measurement, and in the design and evaluation of innovative programs to improve quality and control costs.

Dr. Sennett most recently served as President, Medical Education and Research at the Institute for Functional Medicine, the global leader in functional medicine. He was, before that, President and CEO of the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America (AAFA), a not-for-profit whose mission is to improve the quality of lives of those with asthma and allergic diseases. Prior to joining AAFA, he was a Vice President at WellPoint, one of the nation's largest health benefits companies. He has previously served as President of IMPAQ International, a policy research firm, and as a Fellow in the Economic Studies Program at the Brookings Institution, and as Managing Director for Health Care Finance Reform at Brookings' Engelberg Center for Health Care Reform. Before his work on health care policy, Dr. Sennett served as Chief Medical Officer at MedAssurant (now Inovalon) and as Vice President and Chief Innovation Officer at Ingenix; and held leadership positions in organized medicine at the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American College of Cardiology.

Dr. Sennett serves as a member of the Board of the Informed Patient Institute (IPI). He was a founding member of the Executive Committee of the AMA Physician Consortium for Performance Improvement (AMA-PCPI) and served as Vice-Chair from 2006 to 2009. He is a frequent author and speaker on health care reform, payment innovation, and quality improvement in health care.

Dr. Sennett earned his medical degree from Yale University and his PhD from the MIT Sloan School of Management. He trained in Internal Medicine at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, and is a Board Certified Internist and Fellow of the American College of Physicians.
