



Walker bag has pockets on both sides and attaches with Velcro.

Material

- (1) Fabric piece 18 X 36" to 44" - (does not need to be exact for length) - heavier weight fabric – like heavy twill, denim, canvas, etc.
- (1) Fabric piece 18"x 36" to 44" Heavy or Cotton – thin cotton will need iron on stabilizer added to give it strength.
- (1) -16" pieces of Velcro - sew-on hook and loop fastener.

Instructions

- Cut out your fabric pieces. 18" X 36" to 44" each piece.
- Put right sides.
- Stitch around all the edges leaving 6 inch opening on one end for turning.
- Trim the corners to reduce bulk at corners.
- Turn the fabric inside out and poke out each corner to smooth them out (If you think your fabric will be prone to fraying you may stitch around the edges with a serger or use a zig-zag stitch.)
- Stitch close the turning opening.
- Press all edges.

- **Hook and Loop Fasteners (Velcro) - Important do this step (Velcro) BEFORE pockets.**
- Fold the fabric in half lengthwise to find the center and press.
- Measured down from center 3" on side 1 and side 2 of center and draw a line from left to right sides.
- Side 1 of center place the Hook half and stitch in place.
- Side 2 of center place the Loop half and stitch in place.
- Sew close to the edge of the fasteners on both side 1 and side 2.

Pockets

Side 1 - 1 large pocket.

- Fold the bag in half together and make sure Velcro lines up and all edges are together nicely lined up.
- Take side 1 and fold it up towards the center of bag just above Velcro stitches so you'll be covering them up.
- Stitch left and right sides to make 1 large pocket.
- Backstitching or triangle stitch the corners for strength.

Side 2 – repeat as side 1 – Side 2 has 2 or 3 pockets.

- Mark center line on pocket and sew the line to create 2 pockets.
- Or divide into 3 pockets and stitch 2 lines
- Backstitching or triangle stitch the corners for strength.
