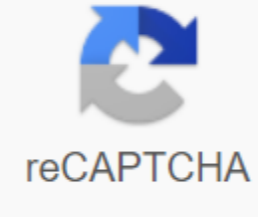

Transfer from icloud to android phone

Source: Joe Marin/Android Central While I love my Android devices and Google ecosystem, I also have my feet firmly planted in the Apple world as well. I spend about half of my time working on iMac, I have an iPhone in addition to my Android phones, and many of my family and friends on Apple devices as well. I suspect many of you are in the same boat. If you have iCloud calendars that you want to access from your Google calendar, what do you do? It's actually quite easy to move this data over; I'll show you how to do it. Open calendar.google.com in your web browser. Source: Android Central In a separate tab, open the icloud.com. Sign up for each account and confirm your identity as needed. On icloud.com, click on the iCloud calendar. Source: Android Central Find the calendar you want to copy and click on the curved lines (which look like a Wi-Fi symbol) to the right of the calendar name. Click on the checkbox for the public calendar. Below, click on Copy Link. Source: Android Central Return to the Google Calendar tab. From the left, click on the q sign next to other calendars. When the dialogue window pops up, click on from the URL. Source: Android Central Paste in a calendar link you copied from iCloud. When the link is pasted, change the text in front of the link with webcal at http. Click Add Calendar and you should see your new calendar appear in the Other Calendars section of your Google calendar. Source: Android Central If, for some reason, 11-12 steps don't work, you can insert a copied URL into the new tab. Then click Add when the dialogue box pops up. Source: Android Central Now your iCloud calendar and previously added events will appear in google calendar views. However, if any subsequent changes to the iCloud calendar are made, you will need to repeat this process because they are out of sync with each other. If you want to keep ecosystems connected, you need to download a third-party app from the Google Play store and keep an eye on customization tips. Ben Stockton If you switch from iPhone to Android, you don't have to ditch iCloud services like iCloud Mail. While Apple doesn't make it easy to set up, you can log in and use your iCloud email address on Android. While we recommend Gmail, you should be able to add your iCloud email address to most email apps. Before you start creating an App-Specific password for iCloud, you need to set up an iCloud account. Apple's two-factor authentication usually makes it difficult to register third-party apps, but allows you to create a separate password for specific apps for use on Android. First, sign up to your Apple account and scroll to the Security section. Security. App-specific passwords, click Create a password. If you don't see this section, you should set up two-factor authentication in your Apple account. To do this, you need a recent Mac, iPhone or iPad. Save the password that Apple generates for you; You'll need to use this instead of an Apple ID password to complete the login process. Set up iCloud Email Access for Gmail With a separate app password, you're ready to sync your iCloud email with Gmail, the default email app for most people who own Android devices. Remember that this process should also work for other email customers, however; we cover more about what's below. First, swipe down

from the top of the device to access the notification shadow, and then tap the gear icon. You can also access Android settings from your app box. In the main settings menu, click Accounts. Depending on your device and the Android version it works for, it may have a slightly different name like Accounts and Backup. If you're using a Samsung device, click the Accounts again in the next menu. For other Android devices, you should be able to skip this step. You see a list of accounts synchronized with your device. Scroll down and click Add account. Choose Personal (IMAP) with the Gmail symbol next to it. The Gmail registration screen is displayed. Use your iCloud email address and then click next. Use the password you generate for you (not the Apple ID password) and then click next. If your email address and password are correct, Android (via Gmail) is in the head and starts syncing your iCloud email account with your device. You may need to confirm some additional settings, such as how often you want Gmail to sync your email. To see if the process is working, start the Gmail app and then click the menu button in the top left version. You should see your iCloud email account with others; click on it to switch to it in Gmail. You can now use your iCloud email address to send and receive emails. Use Microsoft Outlook or other email apps that you don't have to use the Gmail app to get iCloud email on Android. There are other alternatives, such as Microsoft Outlook. The customization process is similar, no matter which app you choose. In the app for example, click on the burger menu and then tap the add account icon (an envelope with a plus sign in the corner). Here, click the iCloud email address and then click On. Outlook automatically detects that you're signing up with an iCloud account, so you don't have to do anything else. Enter the password and then tap the check mark in the upper right-right right to enter it. Now you should be able to view and send from your iCloud email address. If you want to use another email app, look for an IMAP registration option when you sign up for your account or iCloud option. Use your generated password to complete the registration process and you should be able to use iCloud email as if you were on an iOS or Mac device. You can access iCloud photos on Android and you can log into your iCloud inbox, but you can't transfer files. You'll need to log into iCloud using your mobile web browser. You can also set up Gmail to receive Apple email, but synchronizing your calendar and contacts requires a workaround. If you switched from iPhone to Android or use iCloud to Mac, you can access iCloud on Android using a mobile web browser, you just won't be able to sync the files. You can easily access iCloud photos on Android by going to your account from your mobile browser. Click Photos and you'll see all the images you've saved in iCloud. You can also create links to iCloud to share photos and videos, browse albums, and browse your account settings. Another option if you still have an iPhone is to download Google Photos (there is an iOS app) and sync all your photos there. Then they will be on your Android automatically. If you decide to move your photos to Google Photos using the iOS app, keep in mind that downloading may take some time (depending on the number of photos you have, of course). If you have an Apple email address, such as @mac, @me or @icloud, you can access your messages in your iCloud inbox. On an Android smartphone, you can customize this with the Gmail app. Open Gmail and click the Menu button in the top left version. Click Settings. Click Add account - Others. Enter your iCloud email address and click On. Then enter the password and click Next. Gmail then completes the process and then you can access your iCloud inbox. Unfortunately, there's no easy way to access the iCloud calendar or your Android contacts. You'll need an iPhone or iPad and a computer to share your data. On your iPhone or iPad go to the settings. Click on your name. Click iCloud. Switch to contacts and calendars. You may have to log in to your iCloud account first if you haven't. Open a web browser on your computer, go to www.icloud.com and log in to your account. Click the calendar icon. On the left glass, click the Shared Data Calendar button next to the calendar you want to export. In the pop-up, select the Public Calendar. Click Copy Link, then OK. Open a new browser tab or and insert a copied URL. Change the webcal at the beginning of the URL at http and click Enter. This opens the Save file dialog window. Save the file in the folder of your choice. You can rename it too until you edit the .ics extension. Open and enter the Google calendar in your web browser. On the left glass of the Google calendar interface, click the menu arrow on the right right Other calendars. Click Import Calendar. Select an exportable calendar file downloaded from iCloud. You can also choose a Google Destination calendar (if you have more than one) in the same dialogue. Click the Import button to download the file. Once the import is finished, you should be able to see imported entries in the Google calendar web interface and on your Android device. You can follow a similar process to transfer your contacts from your iPhone to your Android smartphone. iCloud is commonly used by iPad, iPhone and Mac users to store photos, videos and other files, store contacts, view calendars, and even send and receive email. However, when it comes to checking iCloud email, you are not limited to one of these Apple devices. In fact, you can log into iCloud and access email from a Windows PC or virtually any other device that runs a standard web browser. You may be somewhat surprised to learn that your iCloud account is fully compatible with your computer's built-in calendar and mail apps, allowing you to access your email, appointments, and reminders through your computer's default feature set. Follow the steps below to get the iCloud email set up in Windows 10. First, you need to add an iCloud account to Windows. Enter the following text in the Windows search box, located in the bottom left corner of the screen next to the Start button: Settings When pop-up menus click on settings: Microsoft Trusted Store, found under the headline Best Match. The Windows settings interface must now be displayed by laying down your desktop. Click on your accounts. Select the email and app account option that is under the Account header on the left menu. Click on the Add account found in email, Calendar, and Contacts. Now you'll have an Add a Account dialogue that includes a list of account types. Choose one labeled iCloud. Enter your iCloud account in the fields provided and click Sign in once complete. There should be a confirmation message informing you that your account has been successfully configured. Click on the Made button to get out of the Add Account interface. Enter the following text in the Windows search box, located in the bottom left corner of the screen next to the Start button: Post When the pop-up menu appears, click on the Mail: Trusted Microsoft Store option, found under the headline Best Match. The Windows Mail app may not work as expected with iCloud email if your account uses two-factor authentication. If you run into a problem when your iCloud account downloads an email or calendar, and displays an error message 'Attention is required', then you may need to check your email from a web browser instead of this option (see the next section below). The Windows Mail app will now be launched with a new account download iCloud email and iCloud calendar. If you're using an older version of Windows or are on another operating system as a whole, you can still access iCloud email from any major web browser. Open the web browser and go to the following URL: Enter the iCloud username (email address) and password by clicking on the login arrow after completion. If your account is enabled for two-factor authentication, you will now be asked to enter a six-digit verification code that should have been sent to your iPad or iPhone. Take this code into the provided fields. Now you may be asked if you trust the browser you use. If you're on a public device or shared computer, we recommend choosing the Don't Trust button. If you're on your personal device and don't want to be asked to enter a verification code every time you log into iCloud, click on Trust. If you're not sure what to do at this time, just choose the Not Now button instead. The icon dashboard will now be displayed, not unlike those on your iOS Home Screen. Choose a Mail icon to send and receive an iCloud email or a calendar icon to access your appointments and reminders.
