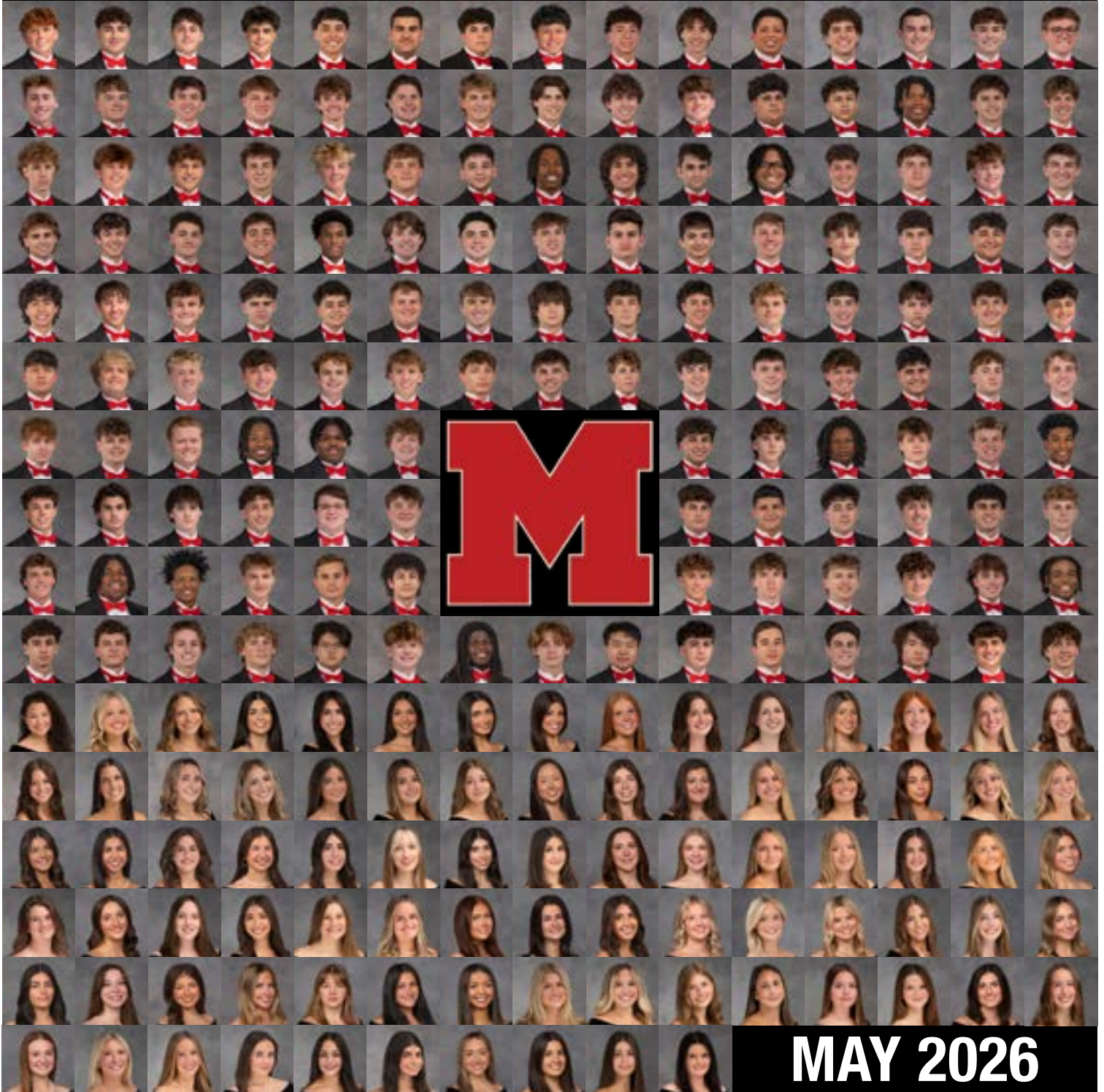

# GREAT Facility IMPROVEMENTS

This month, St. Mary’s will break ground on the Lillian DeRose Constantakis Center for Eaglet Student-Athletes within the Dombrowski Fieldhouse. The renovation features important improvements for all student-athletes, with a special emphasis on creating new, dedicated spaces for the Girls Division. The project is scheduled for completion this fall.

The renovation will transform both levels of the Fieldhouse to better serve the daily needs of Eaglets, with a primary focus on establishing a true home dedicated space for the Girls Division:

**A TRUE HOME FOR GIRLS DIVISION ATHLETES**

The second floor will feature newly constructed locker rooms for female student-athletes, along with dedicated space for team meetings, film review, study, and staff support—fully reflecting their place at the center of the St. Mary’s experience.

**NEXT-GENERATION TRAINING AND CONDITIONING CENTER**

The existing banquet area will be transformed into a modern weight room and conditioning center accessible to all student-athletes, significantly expanding training capacity. The space will also incorporate advanced training technology, including a softball hitting simulator and a golf simulator, supporting year-round skill development.



**EXPANDED AND IMPROVED BOYS LOCKER ROOM**

The current first-floor weight room will be repurposed to expand and enhance the Boys Division locker rooms, improving functionality and overall flow within the Fieldhouse.

This work is made possible by a lead gift from Clarence Constantakis, St. Mary’s Class of 1944. The gift is made in memory of his late wife, Lillian, using her maiden name. Mr. Constantakis’ generosity reflects his belief that St. Mary’s was a life-changing experience and his desire to sustain its mission for current and future students.

“Clarence’s support and belief in St. Mary’s is an inspiration to us,” said Todd Covert, Chief Executive Officer. “This is an investment in our future, and our students will be exceptionally well served by these renovated facilities. It is exciting to think about what lies ahead and the history that continues to inspire it.”

Covert noted that this project represents the first phase of a broader effort that will also include additional student and fan seating at Msgr. Milewski Field, along with an expanded press box.



# UNITY TOWER Renovation

This summer, Orchard Lake Schools will begin the renovation of a historic campus landmark—now newly named the Unity Tower—a project rooted not only in preservation, but in purpose.

The concept of the Unity Tower was developed by the St. Mary’s Preparatory Class of 1975, who’s recent 50th reunion rekindled a deep sense of connection to one another and to exploring the tower restoration. From that shared experience emerged a vision: to establish a visible and lasting symbol that honors the history of Orchard Lake Schools while uniting all past and future generations of graduates. That dialogue led to a comprehensive renovation plan, made possible through the financial support of the class, including a lead anonymous gift funding much of the work.

Perched at a defining point on campus, the Tower overlooks Orchard Lake to the west and the Shrine Chapel to the east—standing, quite literally, between the natural beauty of creation and the spiritual heart of the school. In this way, it reflects the fullness of the Orchard Lake experience: one that forms the whole person, grounded in faith, community, and purpose. In this spirit, the Unity Tower will serve as a reminder of an unbroken line—one that begins with those who first walked these grounds in 1885 and continues forward through each graduating class.



Construction is scheduled to begin in May, with completion anticipated later this year. The scope of the renovation includes:

- 1. STRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENTS:** A new roof and replacement of windows to ensure long-term stability
- 2. RESTORATION WORK:** Interior cleaning and exterior brick restoration to renew the historic structure
- 3. TOWER IDENTITY & CAMPUS Enhancements:** Signage on the tower and at ground level formally establishing the landmark; lighting designed to highlight its beauty; and new landscaping on the Quad side, including commemorative pavers recognizing alumni and supporters.
- 4. A CROSS AT THE TOP** of the tower recognizing the school’s core mission and the Class of 1975’s spiritual commitment.

More than a renovation, this project stands as a quiet but enduring witness: that the strength of the Orchard Lake Schools lies not only in its history, but in the unity of its people—formed in faith and carried forward together.

**Welcome Coach Schaffer (P'03)**



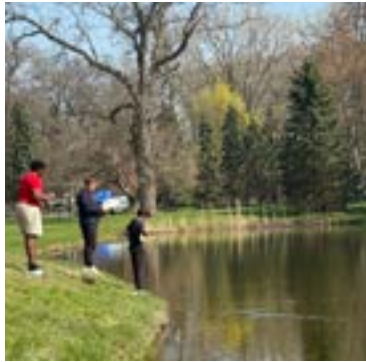

# REFLECTION

One of the important characteristics of the Catholic identity is Marian devotion and the whole month of May is traditionally dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. One of the important Marian celebrations is May 13th, the anniversary of the first apparition of Our Lady in Fatima

(May 13, 1917). This year, since Easter was celebrated early, we are also celebrating the memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, that falls on Monday after the Pentecost (this year on May 25th). An explanation of the title “Mother of the Church,” referring to the Blessed Virgin Mary, was given by St. John Paul II during the general audience on Sep 17, 1997 as follows:

# ST. JOHN PAUL II

After proclaiming Mary a “pre-eminent member”, the “type” and “model” of the Church, the Second Vatican Council says: “The Catholic Church, taught by the Holy Spirit, honours her with filial affection and devotion as a most beloved mother” (Lumen gentium, n. 53).

To tell the truth, the conciliar text does not explicitly attribute the title “Mother of the Church” to the Blessed Virgin, but it unmistakably expresses its content by repeating a statement made in 1748, more than two centuries ago, by Pope Benedict XIV . . .

This title was rather rarely used in the past but has recently become more common in the pronouncements of the Church’s Magisterium and in the devotion of the Christian people. The faithful first called upon Mary with the title “Mother of God”, “Mother of the faithful” or “our Mother”, to emphasize her personal relationship with each of her children.

Later, because of the greater attention paid to the mystery of the Church and to Mary’s relationship to her, the Blessed Virgin began more frequently to be invoked as “Mother of the Church”.



Before the Second Vatican Council, this expression was found in Pope Leo XIII’s Magisterium, in which it is affirmed that Mary is “in all truth mother of the Church”. The title was later used many times in the teachings of John XXIII and Paul VI . . .

The title “Mother of the Church” thus reflects the deep conviction of the Christian faithful, who see in Mary not only the mother of the person of Christ, but also of the faithful. She who is recognized as mother of salvation, life and grace, mother of the saved and mother of the living, is rightly proclaimed Mother of the Church.

Pope Paul VI would have liked the Second Vatican Council itself to have proclaimed “Mary Mother of the Church, that is, of the whole People of God, of the faithful and their Pastors”. He did so himself in his speech at the end of the Council’s third session (21 November 1964), also asking that “henceforth the Blessed Virgin be honoured and invoked with this title by all the Christian people”.

As the first English-language documentary dedicated to this history for an international audience, it brings long-overlooked stories to wider recognition. Hosting Patrick Ney at Orchard Lake is a rare and significant moment for our community. We encourage you to join us and to bring your fathers and families as we mark Father's Day weekend together.
