Nurse Midwife, Author, and Lecturer who
has travelled through many continents. Her

her life as a "woman's advocate" and

Her passion for education has taken her to almost every country in the world, and after nearly 20 years in New Zealand, Irene was presented in 2016 with a unique and rare opportunity to go to China and work from the ground-up developing a Midwifery School System that is sure to set the bar very high in international midwifery circles. Michael Charles Klein Evidence-based care

Dr. Michael C. Klein, author of The

Dissident Doctor is Professor Emeritus of
family practice at the University of British
Columbia, adjunct professor of family
medicine at McGill University and senior
scientist emeritus at the BC Children's

Hospital Research Institute in Vancouver. He teaches at UBC in family practice and midwifery and is a long-time member of the editorial board of Birth. He was head of a McGill teaching centre and the Department of Family Medicine at a McGill teaching hospital in Montreal for seventeen years, and head of the Department of Family Practice at BC Children's and Women's hospitals in Vancouver for ten years.

Dr. Klein is best known for his landmark RCT of episiotomy that demonstrated that routine episiotomy caused the very problems it was supposed to prevent. This work is credited with leading to a dramatic drop in episiotomy and a parallel drop in severe rectal trauma across Canada and beyond. He has researched low volume issues in family practice maternity care, sustainability of family practice maternity care and the role of attitudes and beliefs in medical decision-making. Semi-retired, he continues to teach midwives, both clinical and research skills and mentors family practice physicians for their research projects.
