Zip codes and zip codes are numeric codes used to facilitate mail delivery, and area codes are used to specify a geographic area when calling a phone number. Instead of browsing through a large and cumbersome phone book, you can find and verify zip codes and internet dialing area quite easily. If you have a partial address or address, you can find the zip code by using the USPS Zip Code Check, a tool on the U.S. Postal Service's website. If you don't add focus to the end of your search, Google may display unrelated information. For example, a search for 90210 reveals information about the TV series, while zip code 90210 displays focus information. You can find a zip code with DuckDuckGo, too. Type Zip Code and DuckDuckGo returns a map, zip code location, weather, real estate, and other relevant web results. A postcode check on Bing brings back the city/area it touches, maps and local attractions, such as grocery stores, hotels and theatres. If you type a partial address, Bing completes it for you and reveals the zip code. Like code, you can use a search engine to find an area code by searching the city. To do the opposite and understand no matter where part of the country the area code is related, just enter the area code in the search engine. To find an area code with Google, type the name of the city and country you're looking for, followed by the word area code. You'll usually find what you need. Mobile phones require three. And paid free phone service numbers each have their own dedicated prefix. However, it's important to note that all phone area codes in New Zealand start at number 0, regardless of the type of phone or service used. Typically, the specific numbers used in area codes for landlines and mobile phones depend on the area you are calling. If you're making plans to travel to New Zealand from the U.S., you'll first need to dial 011 to get out of the U.S. phone system. Then dial 64 (The New Zealand Country Code) to access the country's telephone system. Then dial the appropriate double-digit area code (leave the previous 0) followed by the seven-digit phone number. This can be confusing because the phone number is long – you may need to dial multiple times before doing it correctly. But think about it rationally. First, you leave the phone system of your home country, then you log into the system of the country you are reading, and then, you follow the rules within the country to make your call. Landline numbers in New Zealand always last by double digits, the first being 0. If you're calling from your mobile phone, you need to include those two digits to make the call. However, if you call a local number from a New Zealand-based landline, including the area code, it's not necessary. Next Number Specifies the network you are calling. (When dialing a New Zealand mobile phone from the United States, you only need to enter the last two digits.) The mobile network area code ranges from 020 to 029. New Zealand-specific free phone numbers can be accessed from any landline in New Zealand, but you may find one or two that are not available from a mobile phone. In any case, TelstraClear (0508) and Vodafone Telecom (0800) are the designated free dial-up networks in New Zealand. All paid phone services (vendors that list products or consumer services by charging the cost to their phone bill) start in the 0900 area code in New Zealand.
