Hyundai is offering to pay more than \$85 million to settle a class-action lawsuit that was filed after the Korean automaker inflated the horsepower of Hyundai and Kia cars exported to the U.S. Plaintiffs in a lawsuit by roughly 840,000 consumers who bought the 1996 to 2002 model year cars. Hyundai allowed an overstatement of engine power by 10%. Company officials say it was a gaffe that they miscalculated with the effect of U.S. pollution control devices. The company blamed incorrect data - which affected nearly half of cars sold in the U.S. from the mid-1980s to the end of 2002 - of errors and disruption at Hyundai. The miscalculations affected about 1.3 million cars, of which 400,000 were misunderstood by more than 4 percent. The company estimates that the average error among all 1.3 million vehicles was 4.6 horsepower. Hyundai initially proposed providing expanded safeguards and road assistance plans for affected consumers. He tried to downplay the seriousness of the errors, saying that customers who buy Hyundais did not primarily intervene in horsepower. As you know, horsepower is not the main reason for buying Hyundai cars, said Finbarr O'Neill, who was president and CEO of Hyundai Motor America Inc. at the time incorrect data was made. The errors were discovered when the Canadian government questioned horsepower at Elantra. Hyundai advertised the car as having 140 horsepower, but after a Canadian investigation it said tests showed that the figure was actually 135. Consumers did not buy the company's defense and class action suits claimed that Hyundai intentionally inflated engine power to affect potential buyers. Last year, Hyundai thought it had bought its way out of suits when it brokered a deal in a Texas event that would have provided free oil changes and discounts on new vehicles. But lawyers handling a competing case in California objected, and the judge rejected the settlement. The current settlement proposal includes a consolidated class action filed in the Orange County Superior Court in September 2002, which seven cases. In letters sent to owners this month, Hyundai offered prepaid debit cards well to various retailers and valued at \$50 to \$225, or trading cards worth \$100 to \$325 good for parts or services at a Hyundai dealership. The size of the payment depends on the extent to which the horsepower of the vehicle was The largest group of car owners consists of 459,000 people from 1999 to 2002 Hyundai Elantra sedans and from 1997 to 2001 sportscodes Tiburon. Conversely, Toyota Motor and American Honda gained market share, while Nissan Motor's share was flat compared to the beginning of December 2004. Honda's share was 11.8% (against 10.5%) Nissan's market share was 7.4%. Overall, domestic still below long-term historical share levels in December, while U.S. Honda and Toyota rose significantly, GM and Ford are slowly pulling out of their downturns after summer sales events, but they continue to lose share of Toyota and Honda, among others, said Tom Libby, senior director of industry analysis at PIN. Overall, retail sales of new cars in the industry for the first 11 days of December decreased by 14 percent compared to 2004. Aside from Honda (down 3%) and Toyota (by 6%), all multi-franchise manufacturers fell by double digits. December 2004 was an exceptionally strong month of sales, with 18.3-million sales that was driven by year-end stimulus programs, said Bob Schnorbus, chief global forecasting economist at J.D. Power and Associates. , the decrease was less significant than in November 2005. Industry retail sales of new cars fell only 6 percent in early December compared to the beginning of November, and the two corporations, General Motors (on and BMW Corporation (up 3%) showed growth.
