Mark Your Calendars – Sunday September 30th

Earlier this year, Mr. Phil Egan of the Sarnia Historical Society approached Redeemer to consider recognizing Jack Lewis, the first Sarnia Police Officer killed in the line of duty at one of our upcoming Services. Jack Lewis' death took place in 1936 when the infamous gangster Red Ryan was confronted and killed during an attempted armed robbery at the corner of Cromwell and Christina.



The Board of Directors agreed that we would honour this request, but not as a dedicated 'Special' Service. On Sunday September 30th, Redeemer will offer a ten minute window during our regular Worship Service for the Sarnia Historical Society and the Sarnia Police Service to recognize Jack Lewis as Sarnia's first fallen Police Officer. As part of this recognition, Rev. Dr. Roger Ellis will be speaking on behalf of the Sarnia Police Service, having served as their Chaplain for over twenty-five years.

We've also extended an invitation to the members of the Sarnia Police Association to attend. Please mark your calendars and join us on September 30th to share in this community outreach opportunity.



"Praising God Through Song"

"Blessed Assurance" by the Legendary Methodist Hymn Writer Fanny Crosby

Fanny Crosby was born in New York in 1820. She developed an eye infection as a two-month old infant and despite treatment became blind. Four months later her father died, and Fanny was placed in the care of her Christian grandmother because her mother had to find work to support the family. Her grandmother taught her, and most importantly imbued in her a strong spiritual belief. Through her grandmother's teaching, Fanny learned to trust in God and to pray to Him.

She began to write poetry at the age of 8 and as a child could recite the Gospel, Proverbs, the Song of Solomon, and many Psalms - chapter and verse. Her mission in life was to bring people to God through her poetry and music, and she never let her blindness stand in the way of accomplishing her goal.

Though Crosby did put music to a few of her hymns, most music was composed by her husband (who was also blind) or by other musicians who came to her for lyrics. She wrote over 8,000 hymns and gospel songs and continued to write until her death in 1915.

"Blessed Assurance" was written in 1873 while visiting a friend. The popular song reflects Crosby's walk of faith, as expressed by the apostle Paul in Philippians 1:21, "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain".

Other popular hymns include: "All the Way My Saviour Leads Me"; "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross" and "To God be the Glory".
