




IF U.S. LATINOS WERE A STANDALONE ECONOMY, THEY WOULD BE THE 5TH LARGEST IN THE WORLD.

The **U.S. Latino GDP** is larger than that of India, the United Kingdom, France, and other major economies in the world.


LATINO GDP ON THE WORLD STAGE

The U.S. Latino GDP is the **second fastest-growing** among the world's ten largest economies, behind only China.


GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT GROWTH: 2017 TO 2022


Manufacturing is the **largest component** of the Latino economy, reaching \$457.4 billion, or 17% of total U.S. manufacturing.

This is crucial for the recovery of U.S. manufacturing, which has been impacted by supply chain disruptions and geopolitical tensions affecting the economy.




The size of the **10 largest latino economies** grew at a faster rate than their non-Latino counterparts between 2017 and 2022.

AVERAGE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE REAL GROWTH BY STATE (2017-2022)



Latino consumption and purchasing power grew 2.5 times faster than non-Latinos, reaching \$3.78 trillion.

High-income Latino earners grew 6 times faster than non-Latinos. If this trend continues over the next decade, more than **39% of new high-income earners will be Latino**.

Workforce: Without the dynamic Latino cohort, the United States would face greater labor shortages. While the rest of the economy saw a decrease of 673,000 working-age individuals between 2021 and 2022, the U.S. Latino cohort added 725,000, more than offsetting the national loss.

Education: In 2022, U.S. Latino educational attainment improved at a faster rate than the rest of the population at every level, according to Census data.
