### *Major Positions/Accomplishments:*

- Director, first dental clinic specifically for Alzheimer's/Parkinson's patients where oral health services were fully integrated into routine medical management
- one of the first dental researchers to investigate connection between oral disease and systemic diseases; internationally recognized for initial work on relationship between periodontal disease, systemic inflammation, and diabetes
- Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Studies and Director of Wisconsin Geriatric Education Center at Marquette University School of Dentistry
- established one of the first interprofessional education and training models for the approach of "one patient, one medical record and one fully integrated care plan"
- Associate Editor for *Grand Rounds in Oral-Systemic Medicine*, first interprofessional journal dedicated to communicating new scientific information about oral health-systemic health connection and collaborative practice models
- Dean of Gerald Niznick College of Dentistry at University of Manitoba
- established the first International Centre for Oral-Systemic Health (ICOSH) and currently serves as Executive Director; ICOSH received singular international recognition in the form of the prestigious Gies Award for Innovation from the American Dental Education Association
- one of the first internationally recognized leaders in oral-systemic health and interprofessional education and practice; his collaborations with government and healthcare networks in oral-systemic health and interprofessional care have resulted in system and policy changes supporting new comprehensive healthcare and community practice models
