I was on a treat. Our main character, Timmy Rejection, comes from a long line of Fayleures (his ancestors changed the spelling of their name). He lives with his mother and his friend / partner detective agency - fifteen hundred pounds and not very inclined to work polar bear named Total. Timmy and his polar bear run a detective agency called Total Failure, and their business goals are global. Now, Total Failure is not the easiest business venture to sell in a positive light to people, but good grief makes Timmy try. As we quickly learn, Timmy is seemingly oblivious to the stubborn, strangely confident child, though he is actually a terrible detective, with an unwitting penchant for using the wrong words. He leads his teacher to spare, ignores the romantic advances of effusive and tangerine-scented Molly Moskins and makes a terrible treat from Rollo Tookus, his only real friend at school. On the second book, however, we learn that there may be more Timmy then meets the eye. Now, living with his mom in the mansion of his great aunt Colander (abounded in a dive-bomb in love with Torpedo Bob), we discover that Timmy is not as impenetrable or immune to emotion as he once thought. During the school sponsored detective game, we begin to see cracks in Timmy's facade. Perhaps part of why Timmy presents himself as the smartest, brightest and best detective is to mask his fears and insecurities; caring for her mother and who she dates... and serious worries about love and a certain girl named Corinne Corinna.Do you should read pearls before pigs or be familiar pastis' work before immersing in Timmy rejection? Not necessarily, though I think it helps to break into the special tone of his writing and approach: substantial wordplay, pun gags, a mixture of hope and futility, moments of amazing love and warmth, and utterly compelling oddities of the characters, particularly Timmy and the great Aunt Colander. I really wish Colander made an appearance in Book 3 as I liked her warm interactions with Timmy so much in Book 2! As for whether Total is actually a real white or Timmy's best imaginary friend... Well, I leave it open. All in all, I have enjoyed three books, and got some TERRIFIC belly laughs from Timmy's shenanigans. Book 3 offers some revelations about Timmy and Corinne Corinne- and leaves room for more Madcap research. Readers of Jeff Kinney's Diary wimpy Kid book, Dana Simpson Phoebe and her unicorn, Tom Angleberger in the Origami Yoda series and Bill Watterson in Calvin and Hobbs might particularly enjoy this series. ... More fans of Timmy Rejection, prepare yourself for even more greatness! Timmy is back in this - the third book in his series. This time Timmy hired Angel de Manzananas Naranjas to find the Miracle Report - a character report that is so incredible that it got plus plus plus. Timmy also needs to deal with some new enemies such as Scutaro Holmes, the school's new mascot, and Coach Drillashick, baseball's fearsome coach. Timmy is as cute ignorant as ever and still contributes to a very great megalomania. While the book is good fun and easy to read it also contains a lot of interesting and complex vocabulary. The play of Pastis's words and clever drawings certainly contribute to the charm and humor of this book. You don't need to read Timmy's first two books to enjoy this third fun party.
