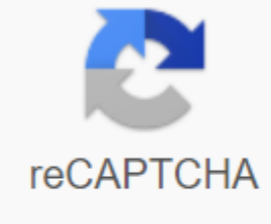

Suicide is the third leading cause of death among children aged 10 to 14, according to the National Institute of Mental Health.It is also the 10th leading cause of death among primary school-age children. Statistically, suicide by children under the age of 10 is a rare occurrence, but that doesn't mean it doesn't happen, Julie Serel, Ph.D., a professor at the University of Kentucky's College of Social Work and president of the American Association of Suicidology, told Healthline. Experts say parents should be aware of warning signs for suicide, even in young children. People think children don't know what death is. It's a myth, Serel said. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recorded at least 1,300 suicides among children ages 5 to 12 between 1999 and 2015. The suicide rate among adolescents is significantly lower (0.31 suicides per 100,000 children aged 5-12 years) than among adolescents (7.04 suicides per 100,000 people aged 13-18 years). But the CDC reported that that rate has risen in recent years, especially among 11- and 12-year-olds. Children who say they want to kill themselves can grow up to be teens who die by suicide, said Jonathan B. Singer, Ph.D., LCSW, an associate professor at Loyola University's School of Social Work, and chairman of the National Association of Social Workers children, adolescents and young adults in the specialty section. Boys are much more likely to die by suicide, research shows. However, the suicide rate among girls aged 10 to 14 rose from 0.5 per 100,000 in 1999 to 1.5 per 100,000 in 2014. This change marks the largest percentage increase reported by the CDC in an analysis detailing the overall increase in suicides among Americans.Access to firearms plays a role in youth suicides. The CDC reports that 38 percent of the 1,300 firearm deaths among U.S. children are the result of suicide. On the other hand, a recent analysis published in Pediatrics found that 64 percent of early teen suicides reported between 2003 and 2012 were associated with hanging, strangulation or strangulation. Other factors include race, a history of mental illness and depression, and - in particular - a diagnosis of attention deficit disorder (ADD) or attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), according to Center for Suicide Prevention and Research at the National Children's Hospital. Clashes in relationships with family members and friends were most likely the triggers of suicide for early teens, while conflicts with friends or girlfriends were more commonly associated with suicide among older teens. Parents are the most significant influence throughout a child's life, but the ability of parents to influence is more significant in childhood than in adolescence, Singer noted. In Colorado, where suicide is the leading cause of death among children ages 10 to 17, the state's 2016 Child Risk Prevention Program called for a comprehensive school suicide prevention initiative. The program teaches school staff to identify and respond to suicide risk factors. It becomes our job as mental health professionals to tell parents that if their children feel that way they need help, said Cerel.Anti-bullying programs create an environment where children are more willing to stand up for each other and where children can feel safe in discussing their problems, in before and including suicidal thoughts, Singer noted. If your child talks about killing himself, saying he wants to die, or that people would be happier if I died, take it seriously, Singer advised her parents. Don't be angry or wave away. It may just be that they are looking for attention, but it is also an opportunity to have a discussion about what it means to be suicidal. It's a learning moment and it tells kids that they can come to their parents with something that can be very scary, he added. This is a lesson that can be transferred to high school and secondary school, when social and academic pressures can accumulate and increase the risk of suicide even higher.
