

How to wash acrylic beanie

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Eric Piasecki I've always loved the idea of using lucite furniture, but I'm afraid my house feels too traditional for such a modern material. Is there a tasteful way to incorporate acrylic pieces into my space? - Becky R. Becky, I'm actually a big fan of Lucite furniture, so you're going to get all sorts of encouragement from me. Let's start with some basics and then get down to the decorating business. 1. What is Lucite? Lucite is actually a brand of acrylic (also called plexiglass). The material was introduced to the market in 1933 by Rohm and Haas. In many ways it looks just like glass, except that it is much stronger and usually about half the weight. Another amazing quality of acrylic is that no matter how thick the product remains almost clear (unlike glass, which develops a more greenish hue). 2. How do you care about acrylic furniture? This is where things can get a little tricky. First, you don't have to use any form of traditional glass cleaner on the material. The chemicals in these products will result in cloud finishing and fascination over time. Search for an acrylic cleaner (you should be able to find several options online) and always use a soft, non-abrasive fabric. 3. What happens if you get a scratch? Any kind of minor scratches can be solved with acrylic tissue polishing (again, a quick search on the internet can provide several options). If by chance you get a deep scratch, it can be polished professionally with polishing wheels. 4. How can you mix it in your home? Okay, now we're on to the fun part. I think your initial concern about it being too much contrast is actually what I like most about the idea of adding it to your home. I especially like to add a sharper piece to the classic room, just to give it a bit of visual energy. Take a look at this wonderful space from Marshall Watson: It's clearly a traditional room, but I love adding these two quick Lucite cocktail tables in front of the sofa left. The tables also help break the visual weight of more traditional wooden tables, allowing more of that charming floor covering to be exposed. Happy Decoration. The button hat was made with my own pattern, and the hat with I was written by loveGeneVilder on craftster Cast on 70 stitches with red wool. Rib (knit 1, purl 1) 12 rows. Change to 6mm needle. Stst 9 line below is the section shown in the chart ... But it's written as instructions. On the next row, it is purl row, purl 33 red, change to black, purl 4 black, black, until the end in red. Knit 32 red, knit 6 black, knit rest in red. Purl 31 red, 3 black, 2 white, 3 black, rest in red. Knit 33 black, 4 white, 33 blackPurl 32 black, 6 white, rest in blackKnit 32 black, 6 white, rest in blackPurl 33 black, 4 white, 33 blackKnit 31 white, 3 black, 4 white, 3 black, 3 black, rest in white. Purl 32 white, 6 black, rest in whiteKnit 33 white, 4 black, rest in white. 1. Cut through under each arm jumper and cut along one of the side seams to end up with one long piece of material. Wrap around the head to measure (with the finished seam to the front of the head, then cut to the desired length 2. Fold the piece vertically 3 times and cut the dome at the top end of the 3. Thread the needle roughly with the length of the hands strand (twice), tie 2 or 3 knots at the very end of the thread to act as a cork when you make your first stitch. 4. Fold the material so the outside is on the inside and make your first stitch. If you push the needle, return it and pass through it again, you can place the needle through the loop you created before tightening the loop. You'll get the hang of it. 5. Sew along the long edge of the seam, right up until you stitched the HALF of one of the domes together. Then place one piece of non-stitched half together with half a dome of a piece next to it (see photo). Keep it going until you're done sewing the whole piece together. You may have to get some more cotton, in which case just cut off the cotton and tie it, re-thread and start again in the same place. 6. Once you are back in the middle of all the domes, add a few supporting stitches to the middle to make sure the seam is nice and strong. Tie cotton, trim the excess and turn it inside out.....
