## Emilio Sanchez Academy Barcelona





Above all, I am happiest that my son was able to reunite with tournament friends he had met before and spend time together again, as well as make several new friends this time, enjoying himself throughout the two days. That, to me, is the true charm of the ES tournament. Also, many players from overseas participated this time. Although my son speaks very little English, experiencing firsthand the challenge of not being able to communicate verbally was itself a valuable lesson. The desire to communicate despite language barriers and the hope to be able to do so is a new discovery and a step forward. The grass courts were very beautiful, and the food trucks were, as always, enjoyable. He was also very happy to get a new T-shirt this time. The overall atmosphere of the tournament was nice and relaxed, unlike the Kanto official tournaments where results tend to dominate and create tension. I want my child to experience such a different kind of environment as well.
- With players gathering from all over Japan and various Asian countries, my son faced opponents with different languages and cultures, and he seemed to think carefully about tennis strategies and how to spend his time during the trip. I believe this became another opportunity for his growth. Finally, I would also like to express my gratitude to the player from Shenzhen who kindly practiced matches with him at the very end.
