I previously experienced the day-to-day reality of international business when I was working as a business plan advisor for Royal Bank of Scotland in Kazakhstan. I worked closely with the British representatives of the bank and helped the bank understand the culture of the country and how the business is done in the country. The commitment and discipline that wrestling requires is a quality that I have taken advantage of in everything I do and they should allow me to succeed in my degree and have chosen And. I hope that I will have the opportunity to join and captain the wrestling team at the university. Since wrestling is not such a common sport in the UK, I may have to find the team myself. I would really like to teach fellow students about sports. I also like to do some more charity work at the university. I really enjoyed volunteering for the Canterbury Pilgrims Hospice, where I raised money for charity through various Christmas themed activities. I hope to make friends with people from different backgrounds at university, so that I can be a bridge between different cultures, not just three. I am committed to my chosen career and I want to enjoy university life to the fullest and take every opportunity inside and outside the classroom so that I can achieve my dreams and please my parents who have never had the opportunities that I have.
