Faces, a very fun and highly sought workshop! Jean is a commissioned textile artist, and national quilt teacher, who began her creative journey at nine years old. She



studied painting with a Flemish artist, while her mom taught her how to sew garments. In 2007, Jean discovered quilting and has completed thousands of quilts! Jean is passionate about quilting and teaching! Classes are designed to be fun, and stress free, ensuring that all quilters from beginners to advanced are successful! Jean's work is featured in three


episodes of Quilting Arts TV.



June

The June presentation will be Carol Ziogas, *Stitching the Sky with a Sashiko and Boro Basics* workshop. It will be exciting to learn a new skill! Carol Ziogas has been sewing most of her life, and became a self-employed artist at 17! She learned how to sew when she was 8 or 9. She was introduced to sashiko, blue and white style, and learning about Japanese design motifs when she was in grade school. Her mother collected shibori, kasuri, and other interesting bits, which she gave to Carol after she turned her interests into a business. She loves to collect textiles and books about textiles,





and discovered a love for traditional Japanese stitching styles – so much so that she has demonstrated her skills at the Tokyo International Quilt Festival. Carol shares her passion for Japanese textiles and stitching.

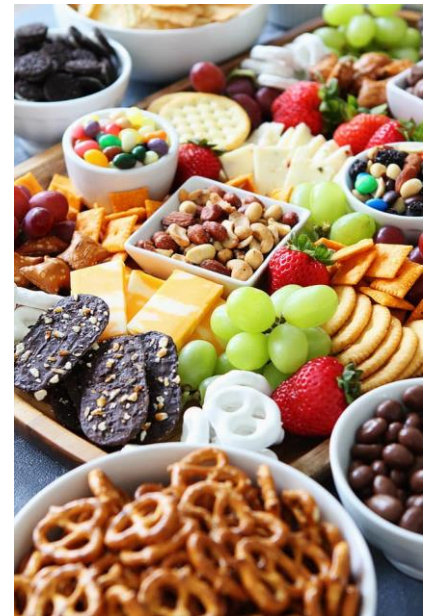

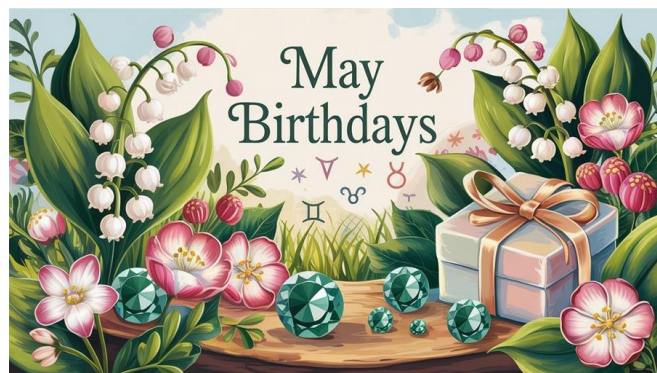

Cheryl Guacci currently has an art quilt on display at the National Quilt Museum (NQM) in Paducah, Kentucky. It was a finalist in the NQM's competition and challenge: New Quilts from an Old Favorite – Food, Glorious Food! Her submission is entitled “Summer’s Bounty” and features a bouquet of fruits in a



watermelon vase against a wonky nine-patch background. It is 24” x 40”. It is made using raw edge applique; machine free-motion quilting and hand embroidery. It will be on exhibit at the NQM until July 28, 2026, and then travel to various US locations returning to Cheryl in June 2027.

Upcoming Workshops

May 14th: **Fabulous Faces** by Jean Impey

Dive into the art of crafting expressive faces with ease and minimal materials. Then, uncover my unique quilting techniques to bring your design to life, from quilting to binding. Skill level is beginning for scrappy applique (using fusible web).



June 11th: **Japanese Sashiko and Boro Basics** by Carol Ziogas

Boro means Rags in Japanese, and each piece speaks volumes about the history of the artist as well as the materials used. We will work with needle, thread, and scrap fabrics to create an arrangement that is uniquely yours in a supportive and laid-back class setting. From beginner to experienced, there is always more to learn about the work we do with our hands, and about yourself!

Learn how by making this unique Quiltworx pattern designed especially for the Quilt Passions shop by Quiltworx Certified Instructor, Pam DiSalvo Pattern (\$40) and kit (\$75) may be purchased at the guild meeting or workshop.



October 15th: **Flowers** by Tina Curran

This pattern uses two techniques -- regular piecing to make the background and raw edge appliqué to make the foreground. What's fun about these quilts is they all come out differently, based what the students bring to class.
