Eventually you will need to collect more than 250 Pokemon to complete the game, including rare and legendary Pokemon. Pokemon Gold features the legendary Ho-O, a firebird and a Pokemon-type flying. You will have to catch Ho-O on the first attempt, as you will face it only once during the game. Earn a seventh badge from Cianwood City. Go back to Goldenrod City and defeat Team Rocket to earn a Rainbow Wing item. Return to Ecruteak City and enter Tin Tower.Proceed to the top floor of the tower where you will find Ho-O waiting on the roof. Save your game before bringing Ho-O as it is the only one in the game and if you lose the fight you will never be able to catch it again. Attract Ho-O by approaching it and pressing the A button. Use electric attacks to paralyze Ho-Oh or sleep-inducing attacks to put it to sleep. Use Ultra Ball or Great Ball to try to capture Ho-O when his health is low (in red) and he sleeps or is paralyzed. Repeat until you successfully capture Ho-O. This may require several attempts to capture Ho-O. Bring a healthy stock of Ultra and Great Balls (at least 10 of each). If you use all your balls without grabbing Ho-O or knocking out Ho-O, restart the game and pick up from your save point to try again. Ho-O has the ability to recover up to half of his life. Brilliant Pokemon are incredibly rare, and if you play Pokemon Diamond, Pearl or Platinum, there's no way to increase the odds more than 1 in 8192. Even so, it's still possible to get shiny Pokemon in Pokemon Sapphire, although chances are that it will take some time. However, with enough patience and ingenuity, you too can have shiny Pokemon yourself. Hunt for ShiniesDecide, which is the Pokemon you want to find as brilliant and determine where it is in the game. Either check pokedex, contact the game's official player manual (purchased separately) or look online to see which Pokemon are in your game and where to find them. Go to Pokemon Mart and buy as many Pokeballs, Big Balls or Ultra Balls as possible. In case of a brilliant encounter, you will need a Pokeball to catch it. The more you have, the more chances you have to catch it. Fly, walk or surf in an area where Pokemon is most common. Take a walk Grass in the area and fight wild Pokemon. If the area is a cave or a pond, just walk or swim around to find wild wild Battle Pokemon to earn experience or run away (in any case does not affect your hunt for shiny Pokemon). You walk, you catch Pokemon, you collect as much as you can, and you visit Poke Stops Stops Load your backpack with goodies to help your trainer along the way. But when it comes to mastering the game, there's a lot more you should consider. Here are some top tips to help you become a Pokemon Pro: The eggs you collect on Poke Stops or get away with gifts will help you get some pokemon as well as get XP and enlarge candies once you put them through the incubator and have passed the required distance - 2km, 5km, 7km or 10km. Each starts with the endless use of an incubator with ∞ symbol but sometimes you will be rewarded with 3x incubators as well as the opportunity to buy them in-store. Use them wisely: Don't waste your 3x incubators, use them for 10km eggs Use an endless incubator for those short 2km eggs Using this technique, you will get more efficient use of these incubators. There's no need to carry every type of Pokemon like a growing collection in your bag - that's what Pokedex is for. Better to keep only the Pokemon you need: it's an army to fight with in the gym and raid battles. Over time, you will find you have enough to develop that Pokemon. It's probably best not to do this with Magikarp because you need 400 candies to develop it and you'll get bored before anything happens.
