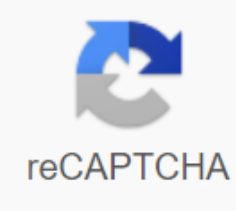

Currently an emeritus professor of psychology and psychiatry at Boston University, Dr. Barlow is also the founder and honorary director of the Center for Anxiety and Related Disorders, one of the largest research clinics of its kind in the world. He was previously an emeritus professor at New York State University in Albany. From 1975 to 1979, he was Professor of Psychiatry and Psychology at Brown University, where he also founded a clinical psychology internship program. From 1969 to 1975, he was a professor of psychiatry at the University of Mississippi Medical Center, where he founded the Medical School Psychology Residency Program.
