Earlier in this chapter, we learned that increasing the diversity of sentences adds interest to the part of the writing and makes the reading process more enjoyable for others. Using a mixture of sentence length and patterns throughout the essay is an important method of writing. However, it was important to avoid making changes to individual proposals. A strong sentence consists of balanced parts that all have the same structure. In this section, we'll look at how to create a balanced sentence structure with parallelism. Parallelism is the use of such a structure in appropriate words, clauses or phrases. This creates a sense of rhythm and balance in the As readers, we often correct faulty concurrency - the lack of a parallel structure - intuitively, because an unbalanced sentence sounds clumsy and poorly constructed. Read the following sentences aloud: Faulty Parallelism: Kelly had to iron, do laundry, and purchase before her parents arrived. Faulty concurrency: Driving a car requires coordination, patience and good vision. Faulty concurrency: Ali prefers jeans in a suit. All these proposals contain erroneous parallelism. While they are actually true, the construction is clumsy and confusing. The first example uses three different forms of verbs. In the second and third examples, the writer begins each sentence with the help of a noun (coordination, jeans), but ends with a phrase (have good eyesight, wear a suit). Now read the same three sentences that have the right parallelism. Correct concurrency: Kelly had to do ironing, washing and shopping before her parents arrived. Proper concurrency: Driving a car requires coordination, patience and good vision. Correct concurrency: Ali prefers to wear jeans in a suit. When these sentences are written using a parallel structure, they sound more aesthetically pleasing because they are balanced. Repeating a grammatical structure also minimizes the amount of work that the reader must do to decode the sentence. This allows the reader to focus on the basic idea in the sentence rather than on how the sentence is put together. An easy way to check the concurrency in writing is to make sure that you have paired nouns with nouns, verbs with verbs, preposition phrases with the preposition phrase, and so on. Emphasize each item in the sentence and make sure the item in question uses the same grammatical form. When you connect two positions with a coordinating link (for, and neither, but, or, nevertheless, so), make sure that the same grammatical structure is used on each side of the connection. Take a look at the following example: Faulty Concurrency: When I get out of a dog, I like to listen to music and talk to friends on the phone. In the second sentence, the grammatical design on each side of the coordination connection (and) is the same, creating a parallel sentence. The same method should be used to attach items or lists in the series: Faulty Concurrency: This committee must decide whether a company should reduce its workforce, reduce its benefits, or reduce workers' wages. Correct parallelism: This committee must decide whether reduce their workforce, cut their benefits or lower workers' wages. The first sentence contains two elements that use the same verb design (reduce, cut) and the third element that another form of verb (decrease). The second sentence uses the same verb design in all three subjects, creating a parallel structure. When comparing the two subjects that are compared, they must have a parallel structure. Comparing two elements without using a parallel structure can lead to confusion as to what is being compared. Comparisons often use words than or how, and the elements on each side of these comparison words should be parallel. Take a look at the following example: Faulty concurrency: Swimming in the ocean is much more difficult than swimming. Proper parallelism: Swimming in the ocean is much more difficult than swimming in a pool. In the first sentence, the elements before the word comparison (than) are not equal to the elements after the word comparison. It seems that the writer compares the action (swimming) with the noun (pool). In the second sentence, the writer uses the same grammatical constructs to create a parallel structure. This explains that the action is compared to another action. To correct some cases of faulty concurrency, you may want to add or delete words in the sentence. Faulty Concurrency: A fast walk is just as good for your health as going for a run. In this example, you should add a verb phrase going to the sentence to clarify that the act of walking is compared to the act of running. A correlative connection is a paired compound that connects the two equal parts of the sentence and shows the connection between the two. Common correlated compounds include: either ... Or not only... But neither... Is it not... or rather ... than both... and correlated compounds must follow the same grammatical structure to create a parallel sentence. Take a look at the following example: Faulty Concurrency: We can neither wait until something happens, nor can we take evasive action. Correct parallelism: We can neither wait until something happens, nor take evasive measures. When using a correlated word, phrase, or position that follows each part, the words, or positions that follow each part must be parallel. In the first sentence, the construction of the second part of the proposal does not correspond to the design of the first part. In the second sentence, omitting unnecessary words and corresponding verb designs create a parallel structure. Sometimes a reshuffling of a sentence corrects faulty concurrency. Faulty concurrency: It was both a long film and a poorly written film. Correct parallelism: The film was long and poorly written. To see examples of parallelism in use, read some of the great historical rhetoric speeches such as Abraham Lincoln and Martin Luther King Jr. Notice how they use parallel structures, highlight important points and create a smooth, easy-to-understand Here's a link to the text, audio, video and music of Martin Luther King's speech I have a dream: Speechwriters use concurrency not only in sentences, but also in all paragraphs and beyond. Repeating specific key phrases throughout a speech is an effective way of tying a paragraph together as a cohesive whole and creating a sense of importance. This method can be adapted to any part of the letter, but it can be especially useful for creating a sentence or other type of compelling document in the workplace. Note that spelling and grammatical testing on most word processors will not draw attention to faulty concurrav. If you correct the document correctly, read it aloud and listen to sentences that sound clumsy or poorly worded. Parallelism creates a sense of rhythm and balance in writing, using the same grammatical structure to express equal ideas. Faulty concurrency occurs when the elements of the sentence are not balanced, making the sentence sound clumsy and awkward. Parallelism can be created by connecting two points or compiling a list using coordination connections: By comparing two elements that use what or how, or by connecting the two parts of the sentence using correlated compounds.
