"How a hare catches a cow: Skills for sustainable thinking"

The workshop's participants will experience sustainable thinking skills like systemthinking, creative thinking and critical thinking. In a participatory way they'll discover the theoretical foundations of these skills and how they can be applied in diverse educational settings. Also, the concept of sustainability will be explored. Because it is often misused, a clear definition is necessary. Furthermore, participants will acquaint themselves with the sustainable thinking skills and experience tools to apply them. Moreover, we consider reflection essential to learning. Therefore, it will be integrated into the workshop. Ultimately, the goal of the workshop is to demonstrate what sustainable thinking skills are and how they can be applied easily in any learning situation. *Djapo has participation in its DNA, so it will also be a key element of the workshop.*
