Immediately after graduating from college, without entrepreneurial experience, he opened his own full-spectrum car wash White loved being his boss and followed the car wash with a string of other business projects. Today he is a franchisee for bluefrog plumbing and drainage and maids. That's how White developed his passion for entrepreneurship. I opened my first Franchise of The Handmaid's Ty in 2001 and still own and run the business. I opened my first bluefrog plumbing and drainage franchise in November 2014. Honestly, I never expected going into franchising until I came across an article in The Wall Street Journal about the growth of the home services industry. I was brought to a commercial and residential cleaning franchise after my own experience looking for a reliable and reliable company to clean my house. After exploring various possibilities, I signed a franchise agreement with the Maids. Since then I have expanded my service offerings in the Dallas/Fort Worth area, joining the bluefrog plumbing and drainage family as the main franchisee for the market. I like the idea of joining proven business models that provide support from both corporate and other franchise owners. What did you do before you became the franchise owner? I've been an entrepreneur since day one. Right after graduating from college, I sold an investment property. In 1987, I purchased a full-service car wash, which I managed and operated from 1987 to 1991. Moving to Dallas, I sold my car wash and acquired an independent environmental and geotechnical drilling operation. The business was bought in 1998 by a national drilling operation that led me to open maids and eventually bluefrog plumbing Drain. Why did you choose this particular franchise? I've been researching various business opportunities in the plumbing industry over the last 10-12 years, but the right opportunity never came up. I actually know Mark Dawson, CEO and president of bluefrog plumbing and drainage, since we were 12. We're friends on Facebook and catch up every few years. He once posted a photo of the Bluefrog Plumbing and Drain logo. I was immediately intrigued, so I sent him a personal message asking him to learn more. We created time to talk and after 15 minutes, I bought the rights to the entire Dallas/Fort Worth market. I was attracted by the experience of the plumbing industry, which was brought by top managers of the franchisor. I also love the bluefrog logo - our name and branding will definitely separate us from competitors in the crowded plumbing space. How much would you estimate you spent before you were officially open for business? Approximately \$90,000. The breakdown read: \$50,000 deductible fee, \$4,150 for stickers and signage, \$11,500 inventory, \$6,125 on vehicles and equipment, \$3,300 corporate training and travel, \$5,000 hiring, \$4,100 attorney fees and \$5,750 advertising. Where do you get most of your tips/make great your research? I've known for years that I wanted to get into the plumbing industry, but this is it long time for the right opportunity to arise. Throughout these years, I have done a lot of research online, including reading industry publications and following news from industry associations. I also spoke with several franchise development teams and their franchisees to determine if they had the best opportunity for me. I knew that recruiting quality and qualified plumbers would be a challenge, but it was harder than I expected. Bluefrog Plumbing and the support team Drain was able to point me in the right direction and did a great job of helping me find first-class candidates, while outsourcing out those who weren't a good fit. What advice do you give to people who want to own their own franchise? Make sure the franchise you are looking for in offers something unique in a particular industry. Last but not least, make sure that the franchisor is committed to building a brand and your business. Too many franchisors are more interested in selling franchises than in helping their franchisees grow their business. What will happen next for you and your business? I bought seven franchises in the Dallas/Fort Worth area from bluefrog plumbing and drainage. I have only recently started working in my first two territories.
