Social work is a specialized aid profession that focuses on helping people from diverse backgrounds solve or cope with the problems in their daily lives. Having a bachelor's degree in social assistance (BSW) is mandated for most social workers, but those who work in healthcare and school environments often need a master's degree (MSW).
