As an example, a section entitled Science Can Be Used to Build a Better World August Comte (1798-1857) will have a graphic image, a window call with a focus on statements and key dates, a bio graph, another callouts with related themes in the book and the pages on which they are found, discussion of theory, key work by the author, a stream of diagrams of how theory evolved, quotes, graphic explanations of theory, and art related to the era in which the theme was written.
