Philip Friedman/Studio D STEP 1: Make a black-and-white copy of the portrait on printer paper and cut. Step 2: To age the picture, lightly brush it with a sponge soaked in a solution a few drops of black craft paint mixed with water. Let the paper dry. Step 3: Cut a piece of the stock card the same size as the photo, glue to the back of the photo, and let dry. With an X-Acto knife, cut the subject's eyes image (s), piercing through the card stock and creating holes about 1/4 inch in diameter. Step 4: Open the back frame, remove the glass and then place the photo inside. Step 5: Insert red mini LED Christmas lights (try Superior Holiday Lighting in a flat version, \$11.26 for a 25-foot string; 1000bulbs.com) through the back of the eye holes. Plug in the light and then replace the support frame - securing it with tape if necessary - and draping it with a fake cobweb. Steal the idea! Add a little extra bite to your photos with fangs: Cut small triangles of white paper and glue or tape them into the subject's mouth.
