# Celebrating Over 63 Years!

**Curriculum Theme:** "Dinosaurs"

Dinosaurs may be extinct, but preschoolers' interest in them is definitely not. As our egg theme ends, we move into large animals that come from eggs. Children are already roaring, pretending to be dinosaurs, and naming many types of them in class, as we start this fun filled theme. During this theme, we want to work on compare and contrast activities, to learn about prehistoric animals and their habitats, as well as how they relate to animals we have today. There will be a lot of digging and stomping at school during this upcoming theme.

Children will come to school at normal times and I will assist the photographer during photos. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately on his/her corresponding photo day. Let me know about any specifications. Siblings enrolled at the school will have a chance to take a photo together and class photos will be available as well. <u>Spring conference</u>: Conferences are an opportunity to talk individually about your child with his or her class teacher. They last about 20 minutes.

Meetings will be held in the church's Music Room, inside the Sanctuary building. The sign-up schedule is currently posted on top of the cubbies. If you are unable to meet on the date scheduled, please contact a teacher to reschedule. Parents who are rescheduling conferences will meet in the classroom before or after school and arrangements can be made for childcare.

Conference date and time are available between 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the following days:

Monday, March 30, or Friday, April 3: for the MWF and 5-Day Class. Tuesday, March 31, or Thursday, April 2: for the T/TH and 5-Day Class.

<u>Summer Camp Information</u>: Camp dates are June 15 to July 24, we are closed July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Camp will be avaiable 2, 3, or 5 days a week on T/TH, MWF, and M-F for all children enrolled at Tam this and next school year. Children who graduate this school year can attend camp if she/he is 5 years old during camp dates. Registration for camp is now open. The forms are near the cubby area in all classrooms. For summer camp questions, please contact Marcela or Lindsey.

#### **Important Notice:**

Please remember to sign your child into school when you drop off, and sign them out when you pick up. It is a state licensing requirement. Several people are forgetting to do so. We will highlight a reminder on the sign in sheets. If needed, we may need to call you back to school to sign in your child or pick him/her up, as children cannot be at school without a parent, guarding, or adult signature.

# **Health Reminder:**

\*Please help keep our school community as healthy as possible! To limit the spread of germs, we ask that you keep your child home if he or she is not feeling well. Germs can spread VERY quickly at school. If your child looks under the weather when he or she wakes up, please give your child a day at home to rest and get better, as symptoms oftentimes get worse as the day goes on. Sometimes, one or two extra days at home is all that is needed.

\*It is hard to be sick at school. Children want their parents right away when they don't feel well, and they will be cozier at home in their bed. If we call parents to pick up a sick child from school, please come get your child quickly. Have a pick-up plan if you are not available for a quick pick-up and let teachers know. We are isolating sick children in the office to help prevent the spread of germs. If we cannot get a hold of parents we will call people on your child's emergency pick up list.

Children need to be symptom-free for 24 hours (with ought symptom suppressing medication) before coming back to school.

\*To prevent the spread of germs we are asking children to wash hands as they enter the classroom or use hand sanitizer if preferred. We recommend they do the same as they leave the classroom. Teachers are sanitizing surfaces every day, asking children to wash hands if they go in their mouth, children wash hands before meals, and we ask them to cover their cough with their arms or tissue. Our cleaning company cleans and disinfects the classroom every night. We have asked them to clean and disinfect surfaces more meticulously due to our recent illnesses, and they deep cleaned the carpets at school this past weekend.

\*It is allergy season, plants are blooming all around and it's windy. Please contact your doctor if your child is showing symptoms of allergies and let us know if your child is taking allergy medication. We are seeing a lot of runny noses and coughs, and that can lead to ear and sinus infections if not treated. Also, allergy symptoms can be confused with cold and other illnesses. We have to treat symptoms as if your child is contagious, so seeing an allergist can help us narrow down possible illnesses and will help your child feel better.

Last week, Rose, Lisa (The Strawberry Preschool Director) and I met to talk about the Coronavirus. We are being tracking the situation, and being diligent with our sick policy and cleaning practices to prepare for any illness. We called the Marin County Health Nurse Office last week to get updated information about the Coronavirus and are keeping track about CDC information. The County Health Nurse told us to keep washing hands, disinfecting surfaces, and isolating children with symptoms of illness (to continue doing what we do for any illness).
