St. Joseph Table

Since the 15th century, St. Joseph's feast day has been celebrated on March 19, a day that typically falls right in the middle of Lent, but that hasn't stopped the laity from orchestrating a great feast in his honor. In particular, Italians have had a special love of Saint Joseph, and a famous miracle led the people of Sicily to begin a tradition known as the Tavola di San Giuseppe (Table of Saint Joseph).

According to legend, when a great famine struck the land of Sicily the villagers immediately prayed to their beloved Saint Joseph for protection and relief. They prayed fervently and pledged that if the rain returned they would hold a special feast to honor God and Saint Joseph. Miraculously the rain started to fall and when the fall harvest came, the people of Sicily prepared a wonderful feast in thanksgiving.

The great feast in honor of Saint Joseph then became an annual tradition and was typically celebrated on March 19. Typically the feast would be held in thanksgiving for a particular intention, remembering how God had blessed a family or city during the past year.

Wealthy families would often invite the poor, homeless and sick to take part in the festivities and excess food would be distributed to those in need. Traditions vary by region and city, but generally all activities for the feast center on a table that is covered in different types of food that hold symbolic value.

The table is usually organized to include steps that lead up to a statue of Saint Joseph, symbolizing the ascent to Heaven.

Vigil lights, incense and various plants create an ambiance of heavenly blessing. Since traditionally Catholics were asked to abstain from meat for the entirety of Lent, the foods used to adorn the table are all meatless. Everything is symbolic, reminding the people of different aspects of the faith.

OCDS Provincial Statutes on Elections

Election of the President (63)

- a) The Spiritual Assistant shall invoke the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In the absence of the Assistant, this shall be the duty of the incumbent President.
- c) Election of the President shall be on a separate ballot from Councilors and shall precede election of the Councilors.
- d) If a majority is not reached by any nominee on the first ballot, the names of the two nominees receiving the highest number of votes shall be placed on the

second ballot. If there is a tie on the second ballot, there shall be a third and final ballot. In the event of a tie on the third ballot, seniority of profession shall be the determining factor of the election. If there is a tie on the profession date, then seniority by age shall determine the election.

Election of the Council (64)

- a) The outgoing president shall preside at the election and conduct it in accordance with item (63) above.
- d) The three Councilors shall be elected on a single ballot. Each voter shall enter on the ballot

their first, second, and third choice for Councilor. First choice candidates shall receive three points in the tabulation of the ballots. Second choice two points, and third choice one point. The candidates with the three highest points shall be elected Councilors. The candidate with the fourth highest points shall be elected Councilor only if the Director of Formation is elected by the local council from one of its newly elected members.

e) In case of ties, the same rules outlined in 63(d) above apply.
