MUSIC - Vocabulary

Making an Album



Producing (making) an album is a complex process. A good producer will make the process easier by doing things correctly and well. The process is completed in four different phases.

Phase 1 is the recording phase. The recording phase is where each instrument and vocal sound are **recorded**. It is best to record each different sound on separate tracks. Then each sound can be adjusted so that they sound well together later in the production. This is all done in a recording **studio**. If phase 1 isn't done well, it will be very difficult or impossible to correct later.

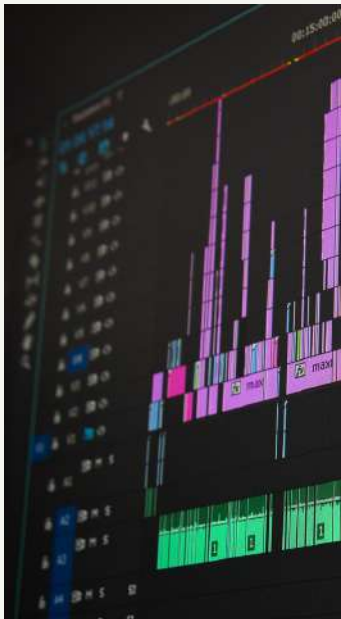

Phase 2 is the **editing** and mixing stage. Usually, many different recordings of each song are made. During this phase, they choose the best recording for each vocal and instrument and put them together. They also adjust the volume level of each track to get the best sound overall.

Phase 3 is the mastering phase. During this phase, the main purpose is to make the sound good and the same for different speakers. The silence time between songs is adjusted, and text for the song titles is added. This is usually done by a different person than phase 2 to let new ears listen for the best sound.

Making an Album



Phase 4 is the printing and the final stage of the process. This stage can be printing a CD to in a factory to be sold in stores, creating a file to be added to a film, or making a file to be sold on the internet. When you print a CD/DVD you often need to make a plastic or paper box and print some artwork or a photo for the cover.

After making an album, you have to **market** it so that people will take interest in your music and want to buy it. This is usually the hardest part of becoming successful in the music business.



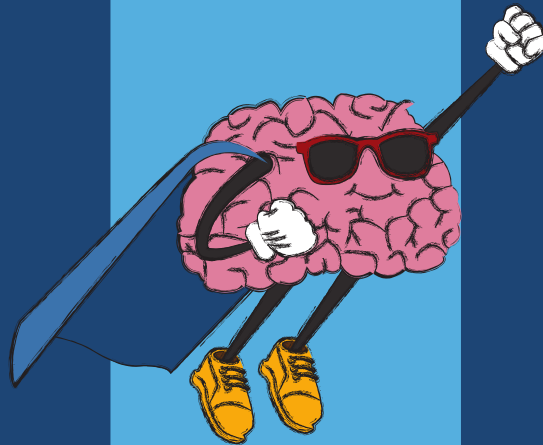
Printed CDs
