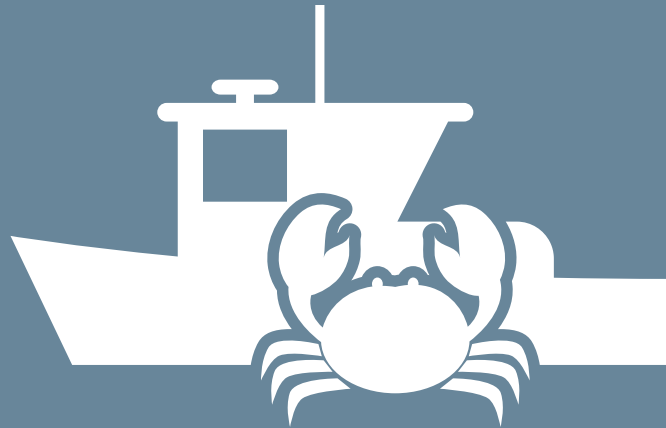

Dangerous Jobs - Vocabulary



commercial: something for business to make money; not for personal reasons (adj)



He has a **commercial** fishing boat, so he sells the fish he catches.

Dangerous Jobs - Vocabulary



salary: the money paid to a worker from the company they work for (n)



Most people want to be a paid a high **salary** for their work.

Dangerous Jobs - Vocabulary



hypothermia: body temperature below 35.0 °C (95.0 °F) as a result of being too cold for too long of a time (n)



The man got caught in a winter storm and almost died of **hypothermia**.

Dangerous Jobs - Vocabulary



fatality: a person who has died by an accident or by violence (n)



There were many **fatalities** when the ship sank in the cold ocean waters.

Crab Fishermen



Life as a **commercial** fisherman is not easy, but each year thousands of workers go to the shores of Alaska, USA, to get on boats to start their jobs. These fishermen work very hard for long hours and sometimes in terrible weather conditions. Commercial fishing is known to be one of the deadliest and dirtiest jobs to have. But among the different fishing jobs in Alaska, one job is the most dangerous, crab fishing. Most choose this dangerous job because the **salary** is high.



Crab Fishermen



Alaska crab fishermen work during the cold months of October to January. They fish many hours away from shore, so if someone gets hurt, they can't drive them to the hospital. The water is icy, and storms happen more often this time of year. They have to work with crab cages that weigh 360 kg, walk on icy decks, and stay in the cold, windy weather for 15-20 hours a day. The workers eat, sleep, and work on the fishing boats. They live on the boats for 3-4 months each year.

Crab Fishermen



Alaskan crab fishing is the most dangerous job in the USA. Each year an average of 34 boats sink, and 24 fishermen die. 80% of the deaths are from falling off the ship into the freezing water. The water is so cold that a person can quickly die of **hypothermia** or drown. The **fatality** rate is 80 times higher than in other dangerous jobs. One fisherman dies every week on average. Also, many fishermen get serious injuries caused by the heavy machinery and gear they work with.



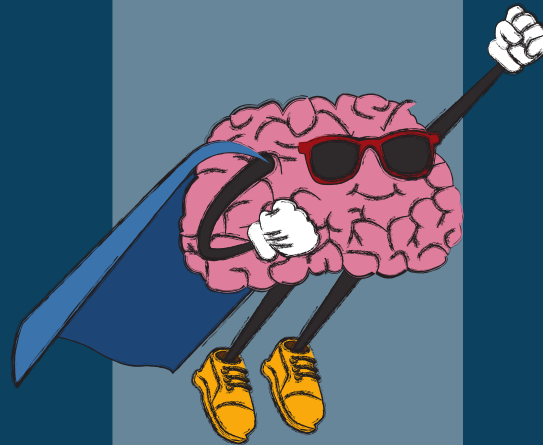
