Working as a miner is one of the most dangerous trade jobs in the world. Miners are workers that dig ore, coal, clay, chalk, or other minerals from the earth. Thousands of workers worldwide die from mining accidents each year. The fatality rate of miners has gotten lower, especially in the past since the late 1900s. Miners work deep underground where shafts and tunnels can cave in, flood, or the **ventilation** can fail. There is also a risk of fires and toxic gases.

Coal mining is more dangerous than mining for metals and other minerals. Coal is very **flammable** and dusty. The dust can easily catch on fire. Coal mines also have a lot of methane gas, which is very explosive, especially if the levels get high. Coal mines go deep underground, so miners have to wear sensors that tell them the oxygen levels and toxic gases levels. Years ago, miners would bring small birds with them. If the birds died, the miners knew they were in danger.

The worst coal mining accident on record happened in the Honkeiko coal mine, located near Benxi in China's Liaoning province. The fatal explosion of the underground coal mine was caused by a mixture of gas and coal dust. Methane gas exploded in one of the shafts on April 26, 1942, and sent flames bursting out of the entrance. It led to the deaths of 1,549 miners. Most of the fatalities were from miners being trapped in the mine without oxygen.
