
Community Life:

Confession of Faith

Second, that the Spirit is given also to me, so that, through true faith, he makes me share in Christ and all his benefits, comforts me, and will remain with me forever.

If you have not yet professed your faith in Christ or you are not a member in good-standing at a gospel-proclaiming church, we ask you instead use this period as a time of reflection.

Following the Invitation

- The elements will be passed. First the bread, then the juice and wine.
- After receiving the elements, wait for instruction for us to partake of the elements together.

Note: The juice is white grape and the wine is red. Gluten-free wafers are available on the plate.
