Note that word classes are also called speech parts. Modern grammars usually recognize four basic classes of words (verb, noun, adjective, adverb) and five other classes of words (determiners, preposition, pronoun, connection, interjection), making nine classes of words (or parts of speech) in total. But note that some grammars use different systems and can recognize eight or ten different classes of words.
