

# The Hidden costs of Covid-19: Protecting our most vulnerable children Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> Jun, 12.00 – 1.30pm

Pressure is mounting on the Scottish Government to increase the amount of time which children will spend in a school setting from August, with the focus of much of the debate being around the impact which the proposed "blended learning" approach will have on academic attainment. In our haste to get back to some semblance of "normality" in the classroom, do we risk losing sight of the need to consider the overall wellbeing of vulnerable children? Those children who are simply not visible and where educational attainment is not the sole, or even the most pressing concern?

With the NSPCC reporting an increase in calls to their protection lines and the worryingly low number of children accessing the school hubs made available to vulnerable children and those of key workers during lock-down, it is vital that when pupils do return to school, all professionals are equipped with the knowledge and procedures to cope with the likelihood of a rise in abuse or neglect disclosures and to be able to identify and support those most in need of additional care.
