If you've upgraded to Android 10 and were surprised not to see the dark theme in Gmail yet, it might be worth taking a second look. Some users have reported a new theme option in the Gmail app settings, which includes dark mode settings. You can also remove members and promote or demote any other person in the group chat. Along with admin privileges, anyone in the group can create a user link that can be sent as a conversation invitation. If admin privileges are disabled, people who click on links will be automatically added to the group. Dark mode is not available in older versions of the operating system. To access the developer's options, go to the phone's settings, scroll down to the build number and tap it a few times until you see a notification that you're now a developer. Then back time and open the system menu out of the settings. Expand the extended section and select the developer options to open a new menu. Scroll down to the faster-rendering header and turn on the Override power slider. This essentially forces all applications to use dark mode, even if they don't support it in their native language. Once you turn it on, try opening the apps and see what they look like. In our testing, while this includes a dark mode for apps such as Amazon, it can also cause mapping problems in other apps. For example, incoming bubbles in Facebook Messenger were hard to see with this mode enabled. Try to decide whether to use it for your apps.
