# Thursday, November 30th, 2023

### This Sunday

First Sunday of Advent - Stir up your power, and come! The psalmist's plea in Psalm 80:2 sets the tone for the Advent season. God "advances" and comes to us—in the past in the history of Israel and the incarnation of Jesus, in the present in the word and sacrament of each Sunday and in the sufferings of our time, and in the future at the end of all things. Today Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open, crying out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

A Spiritual Practice for this Week - Disrupt Advent: make a surprising or ugly Advent wreath with household items. Incorporate the traditional theme words: hope, peace, joy, love. What does this wreath say for you about the meaning of Advent this year?

Sunday School - This Sunday we welcome kids back after Thanksgiving and we are starting our practice for our Christmas Program on December 17th! Sunday School for children K-5 normally follows Children's Word (before the first reading) during worship. Children return during the Peace to join their family for communion.

Advent Fair Today! - All children and families are invited to come together following worship to make an Advent wreath, make holiday mug cakes, and receive Advent-Christmas activity cards for the whole family to enjoy. This event will run concurrently with Coffee Fellowship.

Christmas Program Practice 10:45 AM - Following the Advent Fair, all children and youth who would like to be a part of this year's Christmas Program on December 17th are asked to stay for a half-hour rehearsal.

Advent Supper Sandwich Bar - At the darkest time of year, coming together for a simple meal shared with others enlightens our spirits and feeds our souls. During Wednesdays in Advent beginning December 6th, everyone is invited to gather beginning at 5:00 PM for a sandwich bar supper (serving ends at 5:30 PM). The meal is free, but you can donate funds or food if you'd like (see the sign-up sheets in the Narthex). Donations benefit the Youth Mission Trip.

Wednesday Advent Services - As we prepare for Christmas, we gather for Advent worship beginning December 6th at 6:00 PM. The service is Holden Evening Prayer—a beautiful, quiet service of song, scripture and prayer led by members of the choir. Each week we will hear an Old Testament story about a forerunner of Jesus: Ruth the Moabite, David the Shepherd, and Job the Sufferer.

Second Sunday of Advent - The origin of Advent as a season of fasting to prepare for baptisms at Epiphany is evident on the second and third Sunday, which introduces the preaching and baptismal ministry of John the Baptist. The preaching of John the Baptist calls us to prepare for God—perhaps in many ways quite different from our preparing for Christmas. How do you make room for God's coming in your baptism—your calling to both listen to God deeply and do God's will in the world?
