City. (District 60). The history of Centennial High School began as a 16 x 20 foot structure built in 1873 at 421 North Santa Fe Avenue in what became downtown Pueblo. Six years later, a larger adobe building has grown at Eleventh and Court Streets on Pueblo's north side. This school was first called District 1 High School, or Pueblo High School. When Colorado was inducted into the Union in 1876, it was the first time Colorado had been accepted into the Union. At one point, the locals dropped the article and began referring to the school as a centennial high school. Adobe's building was expanded in the late 1880s, until a larger high school was largely set up until 1921. This building served for more than fifty years until a new campus was built further north on Mountview Drive and Baltimore Avenue in 1973. The new campus featured a large gymnasium, an indoor natatoria with a balcony seating area and the only District 60 planetarium. The old campus was demolished is now the site of District 60 administrative buildings. The museum with recreation font facades from the original building was built on campus and features archival material detailing the school's history and serves as the headquarters of the organization's centuries-old alumni. [2] [3] The first graduate grade in 1884 consisted of seven students. Famous Centennial graduates include David Packard (1930), co-founder of Hewlett-Packard; Morey Bernstein (1937), author of The Search for Bridey Murphy; Edra Jean E.J. Peaker (1958), Broadway, film and television actress; and many of Pueblo's business and political elites. The school colors are red and white, believed to date back to 1894 when a group of school girls wore red and white ribbons in their hair for a football game against Colorado College. The school's mascot, a bulldog, gained acceptance throughout the school around 1912. Centennial uses a variation of the song to fight at the University of Wisconsin, sung as He Centennial, for the school's fight song. Centennial won Colorado's first recognized high school football championship in 1904. Centennial is part of what is believed to be the sixth-oldest high school football rivalry, and the oldest west of the Mississippi River, with its annual game against city rival Central High School. Courtesy of the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office Released Saturday, November 28, 2020 12:29pm Ellis Arnold earnold@coloradocommunitymedia.com A gas station official died after sustaining a gunshot wound to his left abdomen in a robbery on the night of November 26 in Centennial, the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office said. The suspect requested cigarettes and then asked for everything, according to a tweet from the sheriff's office. Surveillance video shows the suspect and the officer talking briefly, the sheriff's office said in a statement. The suspect then pointed a gun at the officer, who put cigarettes and cash from the cash register in a shopping bag, the sheriff's office said in a statement. When the officer handed the suspect the bag, the suspect shot him. The suspect then left the store. Authorities received a call about a shooting at 6:47 p.m. .m. Another gas station in Centennial on East Arapahoe Road was also robbed the same day in an incident in which a suspect fired a single bullet into the ceiling, the sheriff's office said. No other employees or customers were in the store at the time of the first shooting, which occurred at 8263 S. Quebec St., said Deputy John Bartmann, a spokesman for the sheriff's office. But the townspeople later arrived, found the clerk and called 911. The gas station is located on the East County line, north of the Ranch. Deputies provided assistance to the officer before he was taken to a hospital, the sheriff's office tweeted. He was rushed into surgery, where he died, the statement said. The victim was identified as Mauricio Omar Perez, 24, the Arapahoe County

coroner's office said. Perez died of a gunshot wound, the office said in a press release. The suspect in that first shooting is a white man who appears to be in his mid-20s and was wearing a gray hoodie, black and white plaid shirt or jacket, gray pants and tan shoes, the sheriff's office said. He appears to be between 5-foot-3 and 5-foot-7, wearing glasses and has an average build, according to the press release. It was not immediately clear whether the suspect left the scene in a vehicle or on foot - deputies obtained CCTV footage from inside the store, but did not receive footage from outside, Bartmann said. Witnesses who arrived after the shooting told authorities they watched the man pull away from the scene, and the description witnesses gave matched the suspect's description from the video, the statement said. Anyone with information about the incident is undue to call the sheriff's department at 720-874-8477. Anyone with information about the suspect could receive up to \$2,000 while calling themselves anonymous again if they call Metro Denver Crime Stoppers, the organization collects information about unsolved crimes or individuals wanted by police. His number is 720-913-7867. Deputies searched the area with the help of the Douglas County Sheriff's Office and the Lone Tree Police Department, the statement said. Lawmakers do not believe there is any danger to the public because the suspect is at large, Bartmann said. Another gas station in Centennial that same day was also robbed by a suspect with a slightly similar description, the sheriff's office said in a statement on March 30th. About 4.30pm a man entered the Conoco gas station at 10210 E. Arapahoe Road - near South Havana Street - in downtown Centennial and pointed a gun at the officer, the sheriff's office said in a press release. The officer gave the suspect a cash drawer and then the suspect fired one shot into the ceiling, the statement said. The officer was not injured, and the suspect left the area on foot in a southbound direction. The suspect is described as caucasian between the 1700s and 170 meters of medium build wearing a gray tracksuit with neon letters on the front, gray pants, gray shoes, a black face mask and tanned work gloves, the sheriff's office said. The sheriff's department was not yet sure if the suspect was the same person suspected of robbery and murder at a quebec street gas station, Ginger Delgado, .m spokeswoman for the sheriff's office, said at 1 p.m. As for the incident on Arapahoe Road, the sheriff's department did. to assist the public in trying to identify a robbery suspect considered armed and extremely dangerous, according to a statement issued on November 30th. Said.
