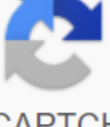


Average yearly rainfall in france

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CELSIUS to FAHRENHEIT CONVERSION Although its latitude (48°52'0N) is about the same as Vancouver or Newfoundland Island in Canada, the city of Paris benefits from a temperate climate as a result of its location in Western Europe and the warming effects of the Gulf Stream. Located in the Paris Basin, located halfway between the oceanic climate in the west and the semi-continental climate to the east, Paris enjoys mild winters and relatively clement summers. Temperatures in Paris tend to range from 5 degrees Celsius (41 degrees Fahrenheit) in winter and 20 degrees Celsius (68 degrees Fahrenheit) in summer. July is the hottest month of the year and January is the coldest. As a rule, Paris is a little warmer than in the suburbs. The effects of urbanization lead to significant temperature changes between the city centre and the outskirts, regularly recording one or two degrees higher in Paris montsouris1 or in The Tour of Saint-Jace, compared to Paris's Le Bourget airport, which is 9 km from the city. In the last century, the coldest winter was in 1953-1954, when the thermometer dropped to -15 degrees Celsius. The coldest day ever recorded was December 10, 1879: -23.9 degrees Celsius (-11 degrees Fahrenheit). While the hottest recorded temperature reached 40.4 degrees Celsius (104.7 degrees Fahrenheit) on July 28, 1948, the deadly August 2003 heatwave produced nine (9) consecutive days of temperatures exceeding 35 degrees Celsius (95 degrees Fahrenheit). These temperatures are quite exceptional, however. Precipitation Spring, from March to May, is the driest season. Precipitation is distributed fairly evenly over other seasons. Average annual precipitation is 607-641 mm (24-25 inches). The highest rainfall in a single day was recorded on 24 August 1987: 95.7 mm (3.77 inches). Paris is known for its frequent downpours, which tend to pass as quickly as they arrive. It's not uncommon to witness the bright sun one moment, then a quick shower followed by a return to sunlight - all within minutes. Therefore, it is practical to carry a small umbrella at all times of the year. Due to the temperate climate, however, snowfall is a kind of rarity in Paris. Although there is at least a dust of snow about 15 days a year, most accumulation usually disappears within 24 hours. The highest snowfall ever recorded in a single day was 40 cm (15.75 inches) on March 2, 1946. Wind The windiest months in Paris, usually from November to average 21-23 km/h. The rest of the year, the city was hit by a pleasant wind of 15-18 km/h. When severe storms hit most of Western Europe on December 27, 1999, the Paris region was hit loss of tens of thousands of trees and significant material damage, with wind gusts reaching 169 km/h (105 mph). Average winter temperatures range from 32 degrees Fahrenheit to 46 degrees Fahrenheit, and average summer temperatures range from 61 to 75 degrees Fahrenheit. For the warmest and sunniest go to the south of the country. The regions of Provence and Languedoc are characterized by mild winters and hot summers. Along the northern and central regions, Paris has a cool and fairly rainy winter, although summers here are usually hot. Winter is much colder in the eastern regions of Alsace-Lorraine and in the mountainous regions of the Alps, Pyrenees and the Central Massif. Bordering the Atlantic Ocean and the English Channel, western France has a temperate Atlantic climate characterized by relatively mild winters (with an average temperature of 45 degrees Fahrenheit). The likelihood of sea fog and heavy rains is a regular feature of the climate. The area receives an average of 200 days of precipitation per year. Brittany, in the far west, is the rainiest place of all, especially between October and November. Summer here is not too hot either with an average temperature of 61 F. As you travel south along the Atlantic coast the weather becomes milder and nicer. Spring precipitation is still abundant, but summers are likely to be warm and dry. Here sunny days are plentiful throughout autumn. Further east, towards the Alsace region, the country has a drier, sunnier climate, but winters can be very cold. In the Central Massif, the climate is harsh and cold. The Mediterranean coast of France rejoices in the hot summer and it is usually very mild all winter too. The region, however, get battered by mistral winds. Cold winter, warm summer, this windy wind blows down the Rhone Valley towards the Riviera. Winter here is the warmest you will find in France. Plenty of winter snow, yes, but the weather in the French Alps varies from north to south. The Northern Savoy Alps can get quite a bit of rain all year round and the temperature remains pretty low. In the warm season, winds blow along the valleys of this region, and by noon clouds formed around most mountain peaks. The southern Alps bordering Provence have a more typical Mediterranean climate, with plenty of sunshine, dry weather, clear skies and no fog and fog.
